The celebration included the entire school participating in the nation-wide sing along of the National Anthem. More than 220,000 students across the country participated in the sing along, sponsored by the American Public Education Foundation.

Prior to the sing along, Stockton fifth graders led the Pledge of Allegiance and students spoke about the history of the National Anthem. After the sing along, the honored guests from the CHFD introduced themselves and led students – most dressed in red, white and blue – on a brief tour of their fire engine and EMS vehicle.
