Rep. Donald Norcross Hosts College Affordability Roundtable at West

Rep. Donald Norcross (NJ-01) on September 1 hosted a college affordability roundtable at Cherry Hill High School West, with leaders from South Jersey colleges and universities, parents, students, teachers and guidance counselors, including several from West.

West Principal Dr. Kwame Morton, Assistant Principal Lou Papa, and Guidance Counselor Carole Roskoph, as well as CHPS Superintendent Dr. Joseph Meloche, all offered perspectives as both educators and parents. Another friendly reminder: Please be patient with the bus drivers for the first two weeks of school, as routes become familiarized and road repairs around the township may cause delays. West students weighed in with their struggles regarding looming college costs.

Rep. Norcross said he would share information from the roundtable session with Congressional colleagues to identify ways to address college affordability.

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
