Gardens Grow!

Gardening season is upon us, and several of our schools are digging in to lessons in science, sustainability and community service.

In education, we often talk about the seeds of ideas, or the seeds of imagination, or the seeds of curiosity. We work to cultivate these seeds in our students to watch their knowledge and awareness grow. We work to cultivate these seeds in ourselves to keep ourselves motivated as lifelong learners. And this time of year, many of us in the Cherry Hill Public Schools guide students in planting seeds – literally – as part of lessons about the bigger world.

Some of our schools – Cherry Hill High School West, John A. Carusi Middle School, pictured above, and James Johnson Elementary School, for example – have earned grants to help make their garden projects a reality. Henry C. Beck for years has been tending their large vegetable garden each spring and summer. Woodcrest Elementary developed its "Peaceful Garden" two years ago and Johnson Elementary School continues to grow vegetables in its garden for sharing among their school community and the community at large. At the Alternative High School, students deliver the harvest from the Courtyard Garden to the Cherry Hill Food Pantry. In 2015, the garden yielded 88 pounds of vegetables. The students at the Alternative School just this week took their gardening skills to Spring Hills Cherry Hill Assisted <u>Living</u> to set up vegetable gardens for the residents there.

All of these gardens and others throughout the district provide hands-on learning for our students not only about the science of plants, but about the rewards of group effort, the importance of sustainable living practices and the value of community outreach.

As students are growing successful gardens at our schools, we are helping them to grow into becoming successful citizens.

Cherry Hill East was one of 57 schools submitting a video submission of a play to this competition. East and Cranford High School received the most "Foxy" award nominations with 10 each.

top rating of Superior. Fermata placed second and also received a Superior Rating. Chamber Singers placed first and received a Superior Rating. Men of Note placed first with a Superior Rating and won the Best Overall Vocal Group for achieving the highest score of all vocal groups participating. Tomas Saed was selected as the Outstanding Vocalist for the entire competition. And the Symphonic Choir received a rating of Excellent.

Among Instrumental groups, the West Orchestra placed second with an Excellent Rating. The Combined Bands placed third (only 1.5 points separated third place from first place) and received the top rating of Superior. The Jazz Ensemble placed first in their category with a Superior Rating and a near perfect score, and won the Best Overall Trophy for having the highest score of the competition. Senior Dylan Hafner (piano) won the Best Jazz Soloist award.

Cherry Hill West will present its final concerts of the season with the Instrumental Pops Concert on June 1 at 7 pm, and the Senior Solo Night Vocal Concert on June 9 at 7 pm, both in the West Auditorium.


