The Cherry Hill Public Schools committed to a district-wide effort officially four years ago, instituting a Board of Education approved Sustainability Plan. As a district, we now weave sustainability into all that we do, from curriculum to lunchroom practices to fitness programs, water bottle filling stations, gardens, recycling, composting, energy efficient lighting and heating systems, just to name a few. Sustainable is what we are!

One great honor that came from this commitment to becoming increasingly more "green" is that all 19 of our schools in October 2015 were awarded the designation of "Sustainable Jersey for Schools Certified."
