The group is composed of Brian Clemens (grade 10), Trombone; Camryn Corris (11), Baritone Saxophone; from 29 schools took part in the academic contest, with questions on ancient Rome's language, history, mythology, literature, and daily life.

In a pool of twelve schools from South Jersey, West's Latin students continued a tradition of excellence. These are the results: West's Latin I team placed third in South Jersey. Congratulations to Sam Coverdale, Luke Fabian, Jenny Ing, Katrina Lewis, and Christine Nguyen.

West's success at this level is especially remarkable because the third and fourth year students prevailed over others in their fourth and fifth years of Latin.

Cherry Hill's Latin students represented six of the top nine teams in South Jersey. Two Cherry Hill teams, one from East and another from West, earned scores placing them among the top ten in New Jersey. A new track also will be installed around each field.


During construction, teams will practice on neighboring practice fields. Any games or track meets occurring during construction will be held as "away" events. The annual STAR Games in May will be held on the fields behind Morris Stadium.

Completion of both turf fields and tracks is expected by the start of the fall 2016 sports season.
