Leap Year, Leap of Faith

Challenging oneself academically or in an extracurricular pursuit can take courage, but pays off exponentially.

Monday is the last day of February – and a Leap Day (the 29th), which happens only every four years. This makes 2016 a Leap Year. The term "leap" to describe the day and the year comes from the fact that while a fixed date in the Gregorian calendar normally advances one day of the week from one year to the next, the date in a leap year will advance two days (beginning March 1st). Because of the extra day added at the end of February, the date "leaps over" one of the days in the week. For example, the Fourth of July fell on a Saturday last year, but this year it will be on a Monday.

Thinking about the concept of a "leap day" and "leap year" brought to my mind how the term "leap" can refer to challenging times in life. Trying something new or unknown may require a "leap of faith" – the ability to do or believe in something or someone, even when the results are not visible or touchable. A daunting concept, isn't it? But great things happen when people are willing to take leaps of faith with a foundation of preparation, ability and as much courage as they can muster. Certainly many of our greatest technological, artistic, medical, athletic and sociological advances owe their success to an initial leap of faith. One person, or group of people, had to take that leap in order for progress to be made.

The same is true for us in the Cherry Hill Public Schools. For students and their parents, deciding to sign up for a challenging class or classes may take a leap of faith. Trying out for a sports team, auditioning for a musical spot or theater role, joining or starting a new club, running for office – these all require a belief that success is possible and worth the effort. I am pleased that our district works tirelessly to promote an atmosphere where our students are encouraged to stretch themselves and try new things; to look at a challenge in a positive light. Nothing makes me happier than to talk with students in all of our schools and hear about their successes and the ways in which they surprised themselves. These are lessons that will carry them far beyond the classrooms here in Cherry Hill.

So I wish you all a "Happy Leap Day" as February comes to a close. May the remaining Leap Year bring great things your way.


