The Season of Giving

UPCOMING EVENTS Our students, staff, faculty and parents all over the Cherry Hill Public Schools are demonstrating the spirit of giving this holiday season.

This is the time of year when all around us, there is talk of gifts. Advertisers ramp up campaigns encouraging us to want and to ask for material things. But in the Cherry Hill Public Schools, we prefer to emphasize the giving side of the holiday season. I've seen wonderful evidence of the spirit of giving as I've visited our schools and have checked in on social media this month.

In our elementary schools, the generosity of students, staff and parents has resulted in the donation of dozens of warm coats to children in need as well as food to families served by the South Jersey Food Bank and the Cherry Hill Food Pantry. Woodcrest Elementary surpassed their goal of raising \$1,000 for families in need by nearly 50 percent this month. The school celebrated with an assembly December 4. Our middle schools are giving their time and resources to help others as well. Beck Middle School is collecting coats for those in need. Carusi Middle School sponsored blood drive to help the American Red Cross shore up its life-saving supply for area hospitals and transfusion centers.

At the high schools, Cherry Hill High School West has just begun the "Rock Your Socks" initiative in partnership with the office of New Jersey Lieutenant Governor Kim Guadagno. "Rock Your Socks" calls on volunteers to buy socks for youth living at Covenant House and to wear crazy-patterned socks to show their support. Principal Dr. Kwame Morton "kicked off" the drive with his challenge on Twitter. I have gladly accepted. 


Woodcrest Raises Big Money, Principal Makes Big Style

Congratulations to Cherry Hill East senior Aaron Groff, named NJ.com's Olympic Conference Runner of the Year after a stellar career on the East Boys Cross Country Team.

Among Groff's achievements this year was breaking a course record at the Olympic Conference Championships at Rowan University with a winning time of 15:14. He also became the first Cherry Hill East boys' cross-country runner in 32 years to win an individual South Jersey sectional, winning the South Jersey Group IV championship. Groff also ran several personal record times throughout the season and qualified for and ran in the Nike Nationals in Portland. Oregon on December 5.

Groff will attend the University of Pennsylvania in the fall, where he will continue his running career. We wish him continued success! illusion and magic.
