We're taking a close look at the Middle School Years in the Cherry Hill Public Schools. Please let us know what you think!

My professional experience in education has allowed me to observe the incredible physical, emotional, and intellectual stages of development that children navigate from preschool through the completion of high school. This journey for children is marked by milestones and accomplishments, by growth spurts and emotional development, and in the varying levels of understanding and patience that are exhibited by family members. For many years, I have firmly believed that our children experience more physical and emotional changes during their middle school years than at any other time in their lives, except from birth to age 3.

The middle school years in Cherry Hill (6th, 7th & 8th grades) are nurtured within our three incredible middle schools – Beck, Carusi, and Rosa. (I had the pleasure of meeting with Rosa students recently, pictured above, and will do the same with Carusi and Beck students in the coming weeks.) The administrators, the teachers and other certificated staff members, and the support staff in these three schools are very special and dedicated individuals. Each school embodies and environment that has evolved to serve the unique needs of this developmental stage.

In April 2015, the middle school principals were tasked with forming a district wide committee to examine the middle school experience in Cherry Hill. When the committee held its initial, formative meeting in May 2015, nearly 30 people, representing each academic department and the each of the three PTAs, spent the day establishing norms and outlining their journey of examining the middle school experience in Cherry Hill. The committee has continued to meet and recently held four public forums to solicit input from the community at large regarding the middle school experience. In fact, you may still share your thoughts electronically until 5 pm, October 21, on our Middle Level Survey. All answers are anonymous.

I am excited when I hear from the committee about their work. The members are inspired and passionate about middle level education. As they continue to look at our children's experience, they will begin to prepare recommendations regarding how to guide the development and improvement of our program. As a district, we are dedicated to engaging in a cycle of self-reflection and continuous improvement. I look forward to continued work of the committee and to seeing their


