

Expected Traffic Issues During Pope's Philadelphia Visit

celebration of healthy, affordable, and sustainably produced food, a grass roots campaign for better food policies. Sustainable Cherry Hill, the Cherry Hill Public Schools and local business sponsors are hosting the 2015 Food Day Festival on October 24 at the Cherry Hill High School East cafeteria from 11 am to 2 pm. Sustainable food related businesses and nonfor-profits will exhibit and make presentations with the focus on children.

The 2015 Food Day priority is to raise awareness about the critical importance of food education starting with our children. When children have the opportunity to learn about, grow, and cook food and understand the implications of food waste on the wider community, they gain the knowledge and tools to lead healthier and more fulfilling lives.

This year's banner contest, "Good Eats, Bad Eats" is designed to increase children's knowledge about nutrition -- what food is good for them and what foods are not and should be avoided.

Banner Contest Rules:

- 1. The Banner contest will be open to Cherry Hill classes from preschool through 12th grades.
- 2. Banners may be of any size.
- 3. Any type of medium

These measures are intended to limit the impact of this event on residential streets, and to enhance safety for motorists and pedestrians in the area throughout the weekend.

We expect a record amount of pedestrian and vehicular traffic in the vicinity of the train station over the course of these four days. Residents should prepare for this increase in traffic volume, and be aware of temporary lane closures and other altered traffic-control devices in the area. Residents in the 100 Block of Bryant Road will only have access to the neighborhood by using South Cranford Road to Bowling Green Drive. The section of Bryant Road leading out to Burnt Mill Road will be CLOSED TO ALL TRAFFIC during the entire weekend.
