Peer Leaders Help with Transition to High School for Freshmen at West

Cherry Hill High School West added a new element this year to welcoming the NJ Department of Health. The grant will fund the construction of a raised-bed garden and rainwater harvesting system. The garden will be used primarily to teach special education students gardening, food prep and other life skills, and to promote fitness, healthy living and healthy food choices.

The garden will be close to West's special education classrooms to accommodate students with physical limitations. Plans include incorporating growing flowers as well vegetables in the garden to be used for career exploration.

One of West's Special Education classrooms has a kitchen which will allow for food prep to teach life skills and promote healthy living. Students will be introduced to gardening as a form of exercise in addition to promoting healthy food choices.

Because there isn't a source of water at the proposed site of the garden, the plans will incorporate a rainwater harvesting system.

The proposed garden site is next to West's existing composting facility, which is used to compost food scraps from the cafeteria kitchen. The composting facility, rainwater harvesting **Kilmer:** Please heed the new "No Parking" signs and yellow curbs in front of Joyce Kilmer Elementary School (pictured above). The Peer Leaders assisted and answered questions as members of the Class of 2019 learned their way around school, received T-shirts funded by the Cherry Hill Education Foundation and enjoyed a cookout lunch with food grilled by Principal Dr. Kwame Morton on August 26.

The Peer Leaders trained at a retreat given by Outward Bound from August 14-16. Outward Bound led leadership training exercises to prepare the Peer Leaders for their year-long role with the freshmen, which will include meeting with them in homeroom throughout the school year. system and garden will teach students about permaculture, green technology, and healthy and sustainable living.

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
