

Even Old Plants Can Be "Swapped" at Earth Festival

As you're gardening this beautiful weekend or continuing some spring cleaning, keep in mind that your "trash" actually may be elegible for recycling at the Sustainable Cherry Hill Earth Festival on April 25.

What can you do to impact our Earth in a positive way at this year's festival at Croft Farm?

 Bring perennials from your garden to swap for new plants and take home grants.

Each grade level will participate in a different sustainability project:

6th grade "Plastic Police" – reducing one-time plastic bottle use;

7th grade "Bugging Out" – saving our insects;

8th grade "Air Ambassadors" – outside air quality control.

The grant check was presented at Beck's Spirit Week Kickoff Assembly, where Principal Dr. Dennis Perry explained that part of the grant would pay for a reusable water bottle for each student, to be used at school at its water chiller bottle-filling station.
