

Angela Duckworth, PhD, Cherry Hill High School East alumnus and researcher on student success, will be presenting her thoughts on "grit" and its key role in long-term success.

Not just for the week, not just for the month, but for years. And working really hard to make that future a reality. Grit is living life like it's a marathon, not a sprint."

Our teachers and staff in the Cherry Hill Public Schools are devoted to helping students develop grit through our curriculum, our schools' culture and support from their teachers, staff and peers.

The school district joins the ranks of leading businesses and organizations who are participating in the ENERGY STAR Low Carbon IT Campaign, including the Commonwealth of Massachusetts, Dell, Inc., HP, Microsoft, OfficeMax and the City of Portland (OR) Public Schools.

Power management enables computers and monitors to go into a low-power sleep mode after a period of inactivity.

Power management has the potential to save up to \$ 50 per computer annually.

Despite the significant savings, according to Lawrence Berkeley National Labs, only five to 10 percent of U.S. organizations have deployed these settings on computers.
