

# PARCC Testing: Week One

After much preparation, discussion and press coverage, the Cherry Hill Public Schools launched its first round of PARCC testing this week. **UPCOMING EVENTS** 

Cherry Hill High School East's Production of Anything Goes March 6 & 7, 7:30 pm March 8, 2 pm PARCC (Partnership for Assessment of Readiness for College and Careers) testing began Tuesday, March 3, 2015, one day later than anticipated after a 2-hour delayed school opening on Monday, March 2. PARCC has been the topic of intense discussion – among residents of the Cherry Hill community, the state of New Jersey and the nation at large. These benchmark assessments, chosen by nine other states in addition to New Jersey, required a great deal of preparation by students, teachers, administrators and our technical staff. Our first day of testing went well, with positive attitudes among the fifth, eighth and eleventh graders tested. Technological glitches arose as expected, but they were few.

The student participation rates for taking the PARCC assessments on March 3 were as follows:

• Elementary School students: 91 percent

• Middle School students: 82 percent

• High School students: 27 percent

We would like to thank all of the people who put in countless hours over the past year-and-a-half making sure the entire District was ready for PARCC. From the technology requirements to scheduling, staffing and student preparedness, our teams rose to the challenge.

The top 40 robots in the state competed at the State Championship. The F Team's first place status means they will compete at the World Championship, held in Louisville, Kentucky in April. The team from East will compete against about 450 other high school teams from more than 20 countries worldwide.

Congratulations to the entire team and their adviser, Mr. Joe Dilks. Continued success to all at the World Championship! synchronized skating, in which she and her team recently won their sixth consecutive National Championship and will compete at the International Skating Union World Synchronized Skating Championships in Ontario, Canada, in April.

A Cherry Hill student from kindergarten through twelfth grade, first at Bret Harte Elementary, then at Rosa International Middle School before Cherry Hill West, Ms. Roth has been skating for nearly as long as she's been a student. Starting when she was just six years old, Ms. Roth says, "I immediately fell in love with the sport." Five years later, in 2006, Ms. Roth tried Synchronized Skating and moved up through increasing difficulty levels in the sport. By age 14, she became an international competitor on Team USA. Ms. Roth and her team appeared on Good Morning America and the Today Show, as well as in newspapers and magazines. "My high school teachers and peers knew me as the Team USA figure skater who would frequently miss weeks of school at a time," she recalls. Still, she managed to earn good grades and take AP classes, eventually earning a spot at Boston University, where she majors in Psychology and minors in Education.

Ms. Roth now skates for the Haydenettes, a prestigious synchronized figure skating team based out of Lexington, Mass. This year, the International Olympic Committee will decide whether to admit synchronized skating into the 2018 Winter Olympic Games. "My team is anxiously waiting for the announcement," she says.

Ms. Roth says her best memories of the Cherry Hill Public Schools are those in the classroom. "I felt that my teachers genuinely cared about my development as a young adult and didn't just see me as another student," she recalls. "I admire my high school AP Statistics teacher, Mr. Drury, for his love for teaching and his students. At the end of each year, he promised to take out to dinner the students who received a 4 or 5 on the AP test. That dinner is one of my favorite memories as a student, because it truly reminds me of how proud I was to accomplish my academic goals with the support of exceptional teachers."

Following her graduation from Boston University in the fall of 2015, Ms. Roth plans to apply to law schools in the Boston area to pursue her goal of working as a special education lawyer. She also hopes to continue skating as a Haydenette for several years after

graduation and to join them in skating in the 2018 Winter Olympic Games, if the sport is admitted.

Her advice to current students? "Strive to make schooling meaningful," she says. "Students will find schooling more meaningful if they can discover the meaning behind what they are learning." And, Ms. Roth says, participate in non-academic activities whether those are sports or the arts, affiliated with school or not - to build friendships and development life skills that will help inside and outside the classroom.
