

## Our Hearty Constitution

This past Wednesday, September 17, was National Constitution Day – the anniversary of the day in 1787 when 39 brave men signed the document that changed the course of history. The United States Constitution maintains the rights and freedoms we enjoy today, both in our community and in our schools.

#### **Back-to-School Nights**

Please note: Back-to-School Nights for Cherry Hill High School West and the Alternative High School have changed. Some of our schools brought the Constitution to life in honor of National Constitution Day. Clara Barton Elementary, for example, ratified a School Constitution on September 17. This project began a week before, with all classrooms in the school creating their own classroom rules. Each teacher then selected two delegates from each classroom to form a Delegates Convention on September 12. The delegates gathered the rules each classroom came up with and used these ideas to write the School Constitution. At the Ratification Assembly, the delegates led all students in a vote, and the School Constitution was adopted unanimously. It reads:

- WE ARE Bucketfillers
- WE ARE safe and smart
- WE ARE followers of the Golden Rule

Part of Clara Barton's Character Education work includes expecting students to be "bucketfillers" rather than "bucketdippers" – meaning that everyone always works to make people feel good, rather than taking good feelings away from them.

To close the assembly, the fourth grade performed a play about the history of the U.S. Constitution.

This is just one example of how our schools weave larger events and news into our daily curriculum.

A.Russell Knight Elementary also marked National Constitution Day with an assembly as well. And of course, all of our elementary, middle and high schools have student governments which make decisions for their schools with student input.
