These coaches, under the direction of Dr. Mary Kline, Supervisor of Curriculum and Instruction, support staff, students, parents and principals with literacy and language arts strategies.

"We provide many resources," says Ms. Katsikas. The coaches' guidance includes providing professional development for teachers, holding parent information nights, working on assessments and modeling lessons for teachers in the classroom.

CHERRY HILL SHREDDING AND RECYCLING DAY

Recycling Event Sunday, Sept. 7, Includes Hard Plastics

Cherry Hill Township will host a free Shredding and Recycling Day for Township residents, from 10 am to 2 pm Sunday, Sept. 7, at the Cherry Hill Public Works Complex, 1 Perina Blvd.

Items that will be collected include single-stream recycling, CFL light bulbs, electronic waste (hard drives will be destroyed), rechargeable batteries, plastic bags, tires (off the rim), used oil and car batteries.

Residents also will have the one-time-only opportunity to recycle "rigid" plastics, including outdoor climbers and other toys, crates, plastic trashcans and buckets, plastic lawn chairs, coolers and pet carriers. programs, Farm-to-School, is entering its sixth year. "Parents are pleased to know that their children are being exposed to healthy and local produce options," Mrs King says.

This school year will bring more charges toward healthier eating. "We will see only whole grain-rich offerings in meals and snacks, the initial steps of a gradual sodium reduction and the implementation of nutrition standards for all food offerings (meals and snacks) sold throughout the school day to students," Mrs. King explains. Katsikas says. "They are amazed at the expectations their children are able to meet as early as kindergarten and first grade."

Check your elementary school's web site staff list to contact your school's literacy coach. Visitors also will receive a few special giveaways, including home insulation kits, reusable shopping bags, and 30-gallon paper yard-waste bags.

Household hazardous waste will not be accepted at the Sept. 7 event.

The Township event is open to residents only; no businesses, please. Limit 3 boxes of shredding material per vehicle.
