We've had a fantastic start to the 2024-2025 school year!



It's been wonderful walking the halls and seeing classrooms full of energy, enthusiasm, and an eagerness to learn. That focus will help us continue on a path of academic growth this year.

Results from our recent state report card show our district continues to make progress. We still have work to do, but we are moving in the right direction, increasing the graduation rate and academic growth.

A few highlights include:

- 88.7% Graduation Rate (up 0.6 from 2022-23, and up 3.4 since 2015)
- Nine Schools Met or Exceeded Growth (Up from 7)
- Middle School Math Proficiency:
 - 6th Grade Ranked 10th in State
 - 7th Grade Ranked 6th in State
 - 8th Grade Ranked 12th in State

Thank you to the students and staff who are fully committed to making this year a great success. I encourage everyone to keep up the momentum: attendance is key!

Lastly, I'd like to extend our thoughts and prayers to the western part of our state. The devastating impact of Hurricane Helene will have lifelong effects.

I'm proud of our school community for stepping up to help by organizing collection sites for much needed supplies for several school communities.

If you are able, we encourage you to participate. Together, we will continue to support our neighbors as they begin to rebuild and recover from this tragedy.

Thank you all for your continued support, and let's keep up the great work!

Davie County High School student Coy James was recognized for being named to the 4A All-State Team in baseball during the spring.


