Student Involvement

ATHLETICS—More than 1,100 male and female students participate on 28 varsity teams.

EXTRACURRICULAR PROGRAMS—More than 1,500 students participate in 90+ programs focused on drama, student government, publications, vocal and instrumental music, and academic, business, community service, and cultural clubs.

Student Awards

- **ENGLISH**—The school newspaper, *Eastside*, and its counterpart, *Eastside Online*, are consistently ranked among the best in the nation by the International Quill & Scroll Society and National Scholastic Press Association, and have been #1 in NJ since 2009.
- **SCIENCE AND MATHEMATICS**—Recognition and awards in international, national, state, and regional competitions in mathematics, biology, physics, and chemistry.
- **ROBOTICS**—Our world-class robotics club has qualified and competed at the Vex World Championship for 13 straight years, including winning the Virtual World Championship in 2020. The club has won the NJ Vex State Championship 8 of the last 13 years.
- **BUSINESS**—Over 300 members make DECA the largest club in the school, and one of the largest chapters in NJ. Multiple finalists at the International DECA Conference (ICDC): 2024 - 3 top winners, 2023 - 4 top winners, 2022 - 1st place winner, 2021 - 3rd place winner. Average of 150 students qualify for the State Competition. Average of 40 students qualify for ICDC, one of the highest averages in NJ.
- **ATHLETICS**—Multiple State & Conference Championships won by Baseball, Swimming, Tennis, Volleyball, Soccer, Bowling, Track, Cross Country, Lacrosse, and Golf. East competes in the Olympic Conference, recognized across NJ as one of the most competitive conferences in the NJSIAA.
- **MUSIC AND DRAMA**—National and state awards in vocal music, jazz band, marching band, wind ensemble, acting, and theatrical productions.
- **WORLD LANGUAGES**—Many students honored annually for achievement on the National Latin Exam, National German Exam, and National French Contest. World Language department offers a flourishing Chinese program.

SECONDARY SCHOOL RECORD – TRANSCRIPT

In evaluating this transcript, please consider the following:

1. Cherry Hill High School East uses a “tracking” system which permits students to take all academic courses on four levels. These are designated as Advanced Placement (AP), Honors (H), Accelerated (A), and Regular College Prep (R).
2. A weighted system of determining a student’s grade point average is used (see above).
3. In July 2009, the Cherry Hill Board of Education adopted a new procedure regarding the reporting of class rank on senior transcripts. Seniors now have the option to either report or not report their class rank to colleges and universities.
4. Because of the weighted system, any students who take the majority of their courses at the R level will show a class rank in the middle three quintiles of the class.
5. The top two quintiles will primarily include those students who take their courses on the AP/Honors and/or Accelerated levels.
6. Since approximately 90% of the graduating class will continue their education after graduation, it is accurate to say that most of the students enrolled in Regular College Prep level courses will enter college.
