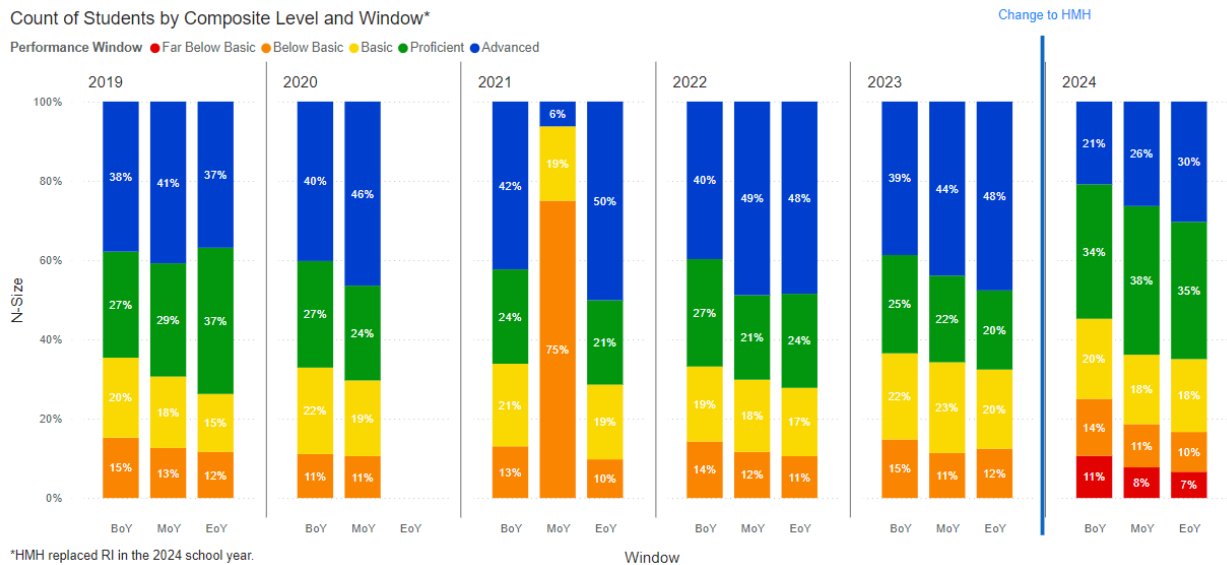

- 2023-2024 goal:
- By June 2024, 47% of students in 7th & 8th grade students will be proficient on R



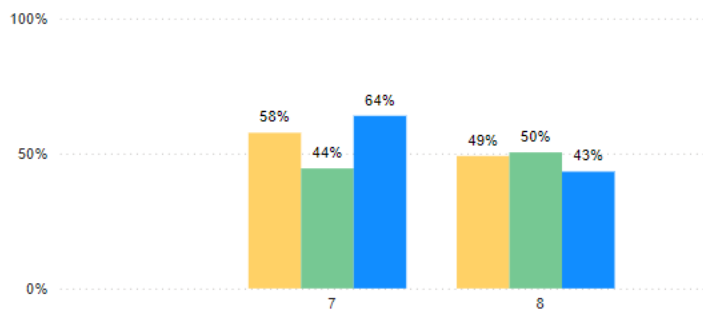
- 2024-2025 goal:
- By June 2025, 52% of students in grade 7 will be proficient on RISE Summative. By June 2025, 60% of students in grade 8 will be proficient on RISE Summative.

- **Numeracy-**

- 2023-2024 goal:
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- By June 2024, 64% of students in 7th grade and 56% of students in 8th grade will be proficient on RISE Summative assessment.

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- 2024-2025 goal:
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- By June 2025, 50% of students in grade 7 will be proficient on RISE Summative. By June 2025, 55% of students in grade 8 will be proficient on RISE Summative.
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- **Climate and Culture goal-**

- 2023-2024 goal:
- By June 2024, we will have no more than an average of 3 incident in Power School per month
- 108 incidents last year (Tier III behaviors)
- 2024-2024 goal:
- By June 2025, 80% of students will "feel safe at school" based on the Stakeholder survey. By June 2025, we will have a 10% decrease in "incidents" from the previous year as logged in Power School.
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- **Science Goal-**

- 2024-2025:
- By June 2025, 50% of students in grade 7 will be proficient on RISE Summative. By June 2025, 63% of students in grade 8 will be proficient on RISE Summative.

- 108 incidences for year - vape detector incidents were majority TCH, automatic suspension

- Numeracy 64% of 7<sup>th</sup> grade - met goal, 43% of 8<sup>th</sup> grade - did not make goal for last year
- Test platform for reading changing for 3<sup>rd</sup> time due to District decisions,
- D and Fs in content areas improvement was not met
- Land trust goals and school goals drastically changed from last year

### **School Board Report – Kristi Swett**

- The Board will be focusing on middle schools, looking at the challenges, issues, resources.
- Board communications don't filter to community or schools. Some conversation of moving 6<sup>th</sup> grade up to middle school, haven't had this conversation but important to make community aware of communications happening at the Board level.
- This Thursday, September 12, is the first meeting about the Bond election. Will be at West High, 7:00 p.m.
- **Oct. 23<sup>rd</sup> at 7:00 p.m. will be the Highland High meeting about the bond.** Factual information will be presented about what the bond is and what will it be used for along with a Q & A. 1968 last time bonded. Since then, re-built an elementary and a District office without a bond.
- 4 components to the bond: Rebuild West High and Highland, build field house and sustainability project. Alan Kearsley has a fact sheet and PowerPoint to share
- Law is that schools can only present information. District cannot actively say or spend money to get people to vote for this, community can.
- \$730 million is the projected amount from the architects.
- If bond passes, looking at spring of 2026 before breaking of ground
- Highland – six-year project, similar to Skyline, will be done in stages, field intact and some parking intact
- West High - three-year project on land across the street, if on site, 10-12 years. All undetermined
