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# Timeline of Events

- **Spring 2019** - Superintendent Student Advisory Committee (SSAC) identified dress code as its priority area
- **Early fall 2021** - Student listening sessions held:
  - Bella Vista High School
  - El Camino Fundamental High School
  - Will Rogers Middle School
- Student dress code survey developed
- Intersection with San Juan Unified's 8-Point Commitment to Educational Justice
- **In 2022**, Dress Code Committee was created to review and update policy



## Dress Code Committee Process

### **2022**

- . Reviewed current policies
- . Calibrated understanding of process
- . Conducted initial survey

### **2023**

- . Created draft policy
- . Gathered input
- . Revised draft policy based on input and feedback

### **2024**

- . Utilized public review data to identify trends to inform next steps
- . Revised policy based on feedback

## THEMED FEEDBACK FROM STAFF, STUDENTS, AND FAMILIES

- Revised dress code allows for freedom of expression
- Reduction of gender bias
- Use of inclusive language
- Allows for comfort and practicality



## Revisions to Policy Based on Feedback

- Edited language to be more accessible
- Removed tube tops and indicated that shirts need to have straps
- Updated language for clarity
- Elementary: added "heel-strap" for shoes
- Clarified language around hoodies

## CORE VALUES:

Students have the right to:

- Be treated fairly without discrimination  
(BP 5132)
- Dress comfortably for an active school day
- Feel good about their bodies

## DRESS CODE PURPOSE:

### PRINCIPLES:

- Maintain a safe learning environment where students can choose their clothing, except in classes where special clothes or shoes are needed or required, such as science (eye or body protection) or PE (athletic attire/shoes)
- Ensure students can participate in all activities with minimal dress code interruptions

## KEY

The primary responsibility for a student's attire resides with the student and their parent(s) or guardian. In addition, the school is responsible for supporting the health and safety of all students.

**Bottoms:** pants, jeans, sweatpants, shorts, skirts, dresses, leggings, fitted pants, ripped jeans

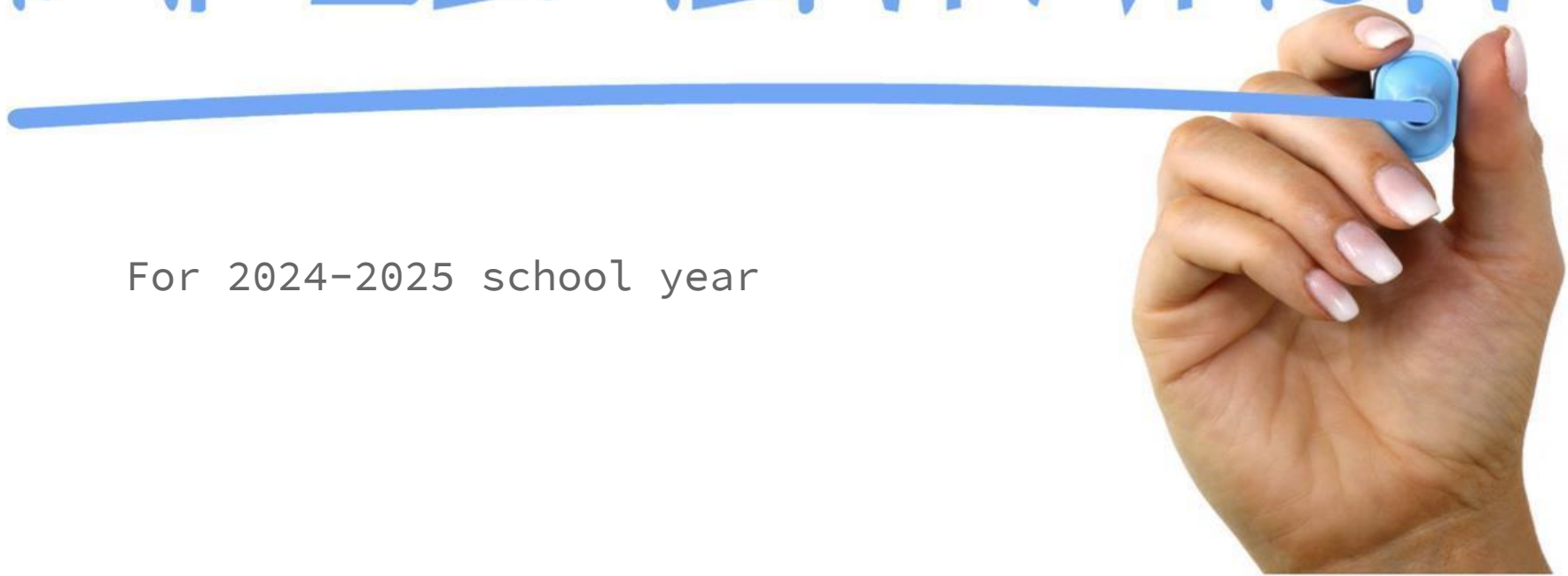
**Headwear:** any headwear that does not cover the face
