This is a Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) between the Northern Bedford County School District and the Northern Bedford County Soccer Booster Club.

1. PURPOSE: The purpose of this memorandum is to outline the roles and responsibilities of both the Northern Bedford County School District and the Northern Bedford County Soccer Booster Club in the installation, maintenance, cleanliness and upkeep of a storage facility located on the Northern Bedford County School District property. A map showing the exact location of the shed will be attached to this MOU.

2. UNDERSTANDINGS OF THE PARTIES:

2.1 The Northern Bedford County School District:

2.1.1 Approve installation plans, location, color scheme and any future modifications to the storage shed.

2.1.2 Determines acceptable maintenance standards and secure the facility in the event that maintenance, cleanliness and upkeep standards are not followed.

2.1.3 Reserves the right to end this MOU for cause.

2.2 The Northern Bedford County Soccer Booster Club:

2.2.1 Maintain appropriate levels of liability insurance (if applicable).

2.2.2 Incure all costs associated with installation, maintenance, cleanliness and upkeep in and around the storage facility.

2.2.3 In the event that the storage facility is no longer being utilized or becomes dilapidated, the booster club is responsible for all associated costs of the removal from school grounds within 30 days of notification.

3.2 **CORRESPONDENCE:** All correspondence to be sent and notices to be given pursuant to this MOU will be addressed to the points of contact identified in section 3.1 above.

3.3 **MODIFICATION:** This MOU may only be modified by the written agreement of the Parties, duly signed by their authorized representatives. This MOU will be reviewed by annually on or around the anniversary of its effective date. Reviewing parties for this MOU will be the Northern Bedford County School District Superintendent and Northern Bedford County Soccer Booster Club President.

3.4 **TERMINATION:** Any party shall have the right to terminate this MOU. If termination of this MOU is required, it shall be accomplished and documented in written format. Upon termination of this MOU, the soccer shed must be removed within 30 days of termination.

3.5 **TRANSFERABILITY:** This MOU is not transferable except with the written consent of the Parties.

3.6 **ENTIRE UNDERSTANDING:** It is expressly understood and agreed that this MOU embodies the entire agreement between the Parties regarding the MOU's subject matter.

3.7 **EFFECTIVE DATE:** This MOU takes effect upon the signature of the last PARTY.
