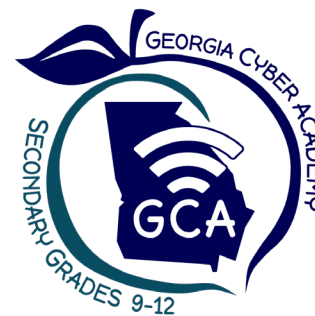

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What is a School-Parent Compact?

A School-Parent Compact is an agreement that parents, students, and teachers develop together. It explains how parents and teachers will work together to ensure all students reach grade-level academic standards.

- Describe how the school will provide resources for specific at-home learning activities to promote student academic growth.
- Describe parent and student responsibilities to engage in specific at-home learning activities to promote academic growth.
- Explain how parents and the school will participate in regular, two-way communication.
- Describe how the school and parents will build and develop a partnership to help children achieve the State's high academic standards.

Our Goals for Student Achievement

District Improvement Plan Goals

- **Goal One:** Improve student performance in all subject areas by 3%, as measured by Georgia Milestones and/or summative assessments by the end of the school year.
- **Goal Two:** Increase graduation rate by three percentage points by the end of SY25.

Secondary Grades 9-12 Goals

- **Goal 1** - By the end of the 24-25 SY, students will demonstrate 5% growth in the number of students scoring proficient or advanced for all Core content and Elective Courses on Interim Assessments 1-4
- **Goal 2** - By the end of the 24-25 SY, the graduation rate will increase to 68%
- **Goal 3** - By the end of the 24-25 SY, students will demonstrate 3% growth on Algebra, Biology, US History and American Lit Milestones End of Course Assessments
- **Goal 4** - By the end of the 24-25 SY, 75% of our students and parents will rate their school experience a 3.0 or higher on a satisfaction survey
- **Goal 5** - By the end of the 24-25 SY, 70% of SGB staff will rate their school experience a 3.0 or higher on the satisfaction survey and 80% will be retained for the 25-26 SY
