General Information

Fresno High School first opened in 1889 and has been at it's current location since 1922. Designated as an *International Baccalaureate* school, it has a student body of 1900 in grades 9-12, 90% of whom qualify for free/reduced lunch. It is accredited by the Western Association of Schools and Colleges (WASC). Fresno is located in the Central San Joaquin Valley and is the fifth largest city in CA, with a population of 525,000.

Our Grades, Class Rank and GPA

The grading scale is based on A=4, B=3, C=2, D=1, and F=0, with the exception of Honors (H), Advanced Placement (AP), or International Baccalaureate (IB) courses, where .04 is added for the first eight (8) courses for each semester grade when a "C" or better grade is earned. The maximum GPA labeled "Augmented Cumulative GPA" is 4.32, and this is also used for ranking purposes. A final ranking is made after the first semester the senior year. (Both cumulative GPAs exclude P.E. and Lab Assistant Courses)

Plans After Graduation (Class of 2024) 53% were eligible for a four-year college. Of the graduates, 24% enrolled in a four-year college and 55% enrolled in a community college. The remaining 21% went to the military, vocation schools or into the workforce.

Programs:

IB Middle Years Programme, Diploma Programme and IB Career Programme: FHS is authorized to offer the IB Middle Years Programme, Diploma Programme, and the Career Programme. All freshman and sophomores are considered MYP students. All Juniors and Seniors take at least one IB course and may opt to take several more, or pursue the full diploma or Career Programme diploma. The Career Programme pathways include JROTC, Digital Media, and Construction Design. The class of 2023 had 10 IB diploma candidates and 4 CP diploma candidates, with one CP student earning the diploma.

CART: CART provides a state-of-the-art research and technology facility where students design and complete projects in collaboration with partners from the local, national, and international business community. Eleventh and twelfth grade students are bussed to CART where they attend halfday classes in one of the laboratories taught by teams of instructors from both education and business. Approximately 15% of Fresno High 11th and 12th grade students enroll at CART.
