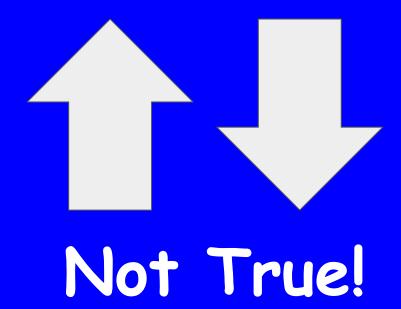

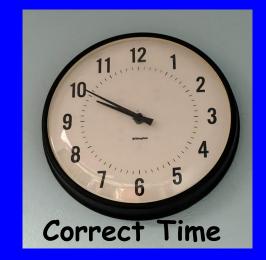

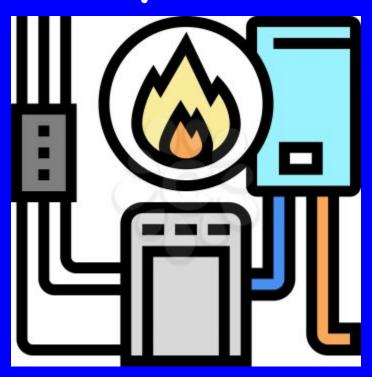


Gym Lighting

Bus Garage

- Bad lighting
- Garage doors in poor condition
- No room to work on buses inside, work has to be done outside
- No lift (only school without one)
- Need to go to Waterville for inspections

Bus Garage

- Lack of storage for parts, tires, and chemicals
- No office space for one-on-one discussions between supervisor and staff
- Inadequate break room space
- Buses barely fit in the garage
