## **Bulletin Board Presentation: Hope View Elementary**

Christy Luckey, Principal of Hope View Elementary, alongside TK teacher Ms. Audie Kuns, shared how the school is enhancing family engagement strategies, inspired by professional development from Ron Mirr's framework. Hope View adopted various initiatives, including interactive Back-to-School Nights and Social Emotional Learning (SEL) practices, like personalized greetings and restorative circles. Family engagement events have been highly successful, with activities that help parents understand their child's development and learning needs. Hope View also



embraced the challenge of conducting home visits to strengthen connections. These efforts foster deeper partnerships between families and the school, contributing to the students' academic, social, and emotional success.

PBIS is an approach that prioritizes students' emotional and behavioral growth, fostering increased engagement while reducing behavioral challenges. By helping schools implement evidence-based behavioral strategies, PBIS supports the development of positive social and emotional outcomes for every student.

#### **Golden View School HVAC Report**

Interim Superintendent Dr. Julianne Hoefer delivered a presentation outlining the District's recommendation for students to remain at Golden View during the 2024-25 school year. Provisions will be made to ensure the comfort and safety of students and staff until the Heating, Ventilation, and Air Conditioning (HVAC) system is replaced during summer 2025. This recommendation was based on a community feedback survey and staff preferences. The Board concurred with the District's recommendation to keep students on campus for the school year. ### **Overnight Field Trip Presentation**

Dr. Alice Lee, Assistant Superintendent, Educational Services, presented the District's subsidy recommendation for overnight field trips. There are two subsidies: for those field trips within Orange County, the District will provide free transportation to and from the destination, along with a \$50 per pupil allocation; for trips outside of Orange County, a \$50 per pupil allocation would still be provided.
