Advisory is a place where small groups of students can build connections with each other and a trusted adult.

FOOD

The dining room is open for breakfast, lunch, and afternoon snacks.

Healthy meals are prepared fresh each day; students also bring food from home

AFTER SCHOOL

After-school activities include clubs, play practices, and athletics.

Students often meet with teachers or work in the Brain and Learning Lab, which helps support student learning and academic growth.

After-school study hall in the library goes until 6 p.m. every day.

Buses depart around 3:30 p.m.; two evening activity buses leave around 6 p.m. Students need to be enrolled on the bus program in order to take the bus.

All activities and after-school study hall are free.

HOMEWORK

Students receive approximately 50 minutes of homework in 5th grade; 60 minutes in 6th grade; 70 minutes in 7th grade; and 80 minutes in 8th grade. Assignments are posted online. All students have supervised study hall or free periods to work on homework.
