District Goals 2024-2025

- Increase the percentage of all students scoring proficient or distinguished on Reading Milestones.
- Increase the percentage of all students scoring proficient or distinguished on the Math Milestones.

School Goals 2024-2025 Literacy

By May 2025:

- 80% of grades K-2 students will show typical growth as measured by the i-Ready Reading Diagnostic.
- Grades 3-5 students will increase English Language Arts content mastery from 57.3% to 60%.

Math

By May 2025:

- 80% of grades K-2 students will show typical growth as measured by the i-Ready Math Diagnostic.
- Grades 3-5 students will increase Math content mastery by 3% or higher.

Teachers, Parents, and Students Working Together for Success

Dunwoody Springs ES will:

- **K-2 Reading** – Host a Family Literacy Night to assist parents in strengthening phonemic awareness and phonics skills, with strategies and activities that can be used to continue learning at home.
- **3-5 Reading** – Host a Family Literacy Night to assist parents in strengthening vocabulary and reading comprehension, with strategies and text passages that can be used to continue learning at home.
- **K-2 Math** – Provide parents Math fact cards and strategy journals to take home to build children's fluency in counting, addition, and subtraction.
- **3-5 Math** – Provide parents Math fact cards and strategy journals to take home to build children's fluency with addition, subtraction, multiplication, division, money, and fractions.

Families will:

- **K-2 Reading** – Attend Family Literacy Night to learn how to strengthen children's phonemic awareness and phonics skills and use provided strategies and activities to continue learning at home.
- **3-5 Reading** – Attend Family Literacy Night to learn how to strengthen children's vocabulary and reading comprehension skills and use provided strategies and text passages to continue learning at home.
- **K-2 Math** – Help children at home by using provided math fact fluency cards and strategy journals to build fluency in counting, addition, and subtraction.
- **3-5 Math** – Help children at home by using provided math fact fluency cards and strategy journals to build fluency in addition, subtraction, multiplication, division, money, and fractions.

Students will:

- **K-2 Reading** – Use phonemic awareness and phonics strategies and activities from Family Literacy Night with the support of a family member at home.
- **3-5 Reading** – Practice reading nightly using text passages that strengthen vocabulary and reading comprehension with the support of a family member at home.
- **K-2 Math** – Practice math nightly by reviewing math fact fluency flash cards (counting, addition, and subtraction) and using strategy journals with the support of a family member at home.
- **3-5 Math** – Practice math nightly by reviewing math fact fluency flash cards (addition, subtraction, multiplication, etc.) and using strategy journals with a family member at home.
