Principal's Report Agenda Item 5.1

We are excited to get back to a more traditional form of recruiting this year. November is traditionally the start of our recruiting season for our future students. On November 9th, we had our annual Tour of Tech and Nick Parrott has been at several schools already doing a variety of recruiting events. Our 2022-2023 application has been open for just a few weeks and we are pleased to see 185 students have enrolled for next year. This is an encouraging number as it is higher than last year. On October 27th, we had our annual Celebration of Partnerships. At this meeting, we

On October 27th, we had our annual Celebration of Partnerships. At this meeting, we had over 100 in person advisory members that met with each of our programs and many more on site through virtual means. At this meeting, our instructors discuss what is going on at Tech Campus, with our students and where the program will be headed. We focus on three facets of an advisory committee; Advise, Assist and Advocate. These three facets are paramount in helping our partners learn how they can help Tech Campus and our students. Principal Burress explained each of these facets through an all school virtual presentation that showcased some of our partners and

how they advise Tech Campus, Assist Tech Campus and advocate for Tech Campus and our students. The meeting was well received and we look forward to continuing it into the future.

Associate Principal Report Agenda Item 5.2

Tech Campus is finishing updating the virtual tour with EAB/YouVisit that should be available to everyone in December. This tour will include videos with students in the program areas.

Future Quest was held October 19, 20, and 21. We received a lot of positive feedback from students, parents, and school chaperones. Busing issues did cause some schools to not attend this year, but they still gave parents an opportunity to register their student and provide transportation. We had approximately 500 middle schoolers attend the event.

All middle schools have received a copy of the Lake County Area Vocational Career Guide to assist in guiding conversations with parent, counselors and students on narrowing down likes and dislikes as they enter high school. This magazine highlights options locally in Lake and the surrounding counties.

All elementary schools in Lake County that have kindergarten classrooms received a set of career figures, career puppets, and Community Helper books. A curriculum was also sent with these materials to highlight how to utilize these within existing curriculum (STEM, ELA, and MATH).

Grants are in full swing and we are beginning reimbursements of Perkins activities. We have yet to receive any CTEI funds. Also, all schools will be doing an update to their Local Needs Assessment this spring. Updated data from ISBE is forthcoming.
