Tuesday, Oct. 1, is the October Count Day for all Colorado public school districts. This time is crucial for our schools, as student attendance during the October Count window directly impacts the funding we receive to support our educational programs. The more students attending school during the October Count window means more resources to enhance learning opportunities for all students. These funds help us provide important services such as classroom materials, extracurricular activities, and additional academic support.

Also on Tuesday, Oct. 1, all Mapleton students are invited to **out-crunch the competition** as a part of the **Mountain Plains Crunch Off and Colorado Proud School Meal Day**. Nutrition Services will provide schools with locally grown apples from Williams Orchards. Gifted and Talented professional learning courses available in October and November

Teaching & Learning is offering two hybrid courses this semester designed to build educators' understanding of the Gifted and Talented students in our district.
