"Noticing" by Kobi Yamada (K-3rd Grade)

This is a story about noticing the little things, the grand big things, the imaginary, and sometimes, hidden things. It's a tale about embracing what's possible. Written by New York Times best-selling author Kobi Yamada, Noticing follows the discoveries of a painter and her young protégé. Together, they explore what it means to observe with your heart and use your imagination to expand your vision.

"The Other Half of Happy" by Rebecca Balcarcel (4th-8th Grade)

The Other Half of Happy by Rebecca Balcárcel is a heartfelt and captivating coming-of age novel that explores themes of cultural identity, family dynamics, and the journey to self-discovery through

the eyes of a young girl named Quijana. The story follows Quijana, a girl torn between her Guatemalan and American heritage, struggling to find her place in the world. Balcárcel skillfully weaves together the complexities of Quijana's multicultural background, her internal conflicts, and the external pressures from her family and peers. One of the most compelling aspects of the novel is its portrayal of family relationships. Quijana navigates the challenges of having a father deeply rooted in Guatemalan culture while her mother embraces American ways, creating a tug-of-war in Quijana's own identity formation. Through these familial tensions and bonds, Balcárcel delves into universal themes of belonging and acceptance.

The Measure by Nikki Erlick (9th-12th Grade)

The Measure takes you on a journey of 8 strangers who soon become connected in ways that are not expected. It seems like any other day. You wake up, pour a cup of coffee, and head out. But today, when you open your front door, waiting for you is a small wooden box. This box holds your fate inside: the answer to the exact number of years you will live. From suburban doorsteps to desert tents, every person on every continent receives the same box. In an instant, the world is thrust into a collective frenzy. Where did these boxes come from? What do they mean? Is there truth to what they promise? As society comes together and pulls apart, everyone faces the same shocking choice: Do they wish to know how long they'll live? And, if so, what will they do with that knowledge?

YMCA before and after care programs in Mapleton

Did you know Mapleton Public Schools partners with the YMCA of Metro Denver to provide before and after school care to Mapleton students, 5-12 years of age?

It's true!

Before and after school care is available at three sites in Mapleton. The YMCA does charge a fee for these services. Mapleton's Transportation team provides bus services for students, taking them from before-school care to their school, and from school to after-school care if they do not attend a school that has a YMCA site. The YMCA partners with the <u>Colorado Child Care Assistance Program (CCCAP</u>) which provides child care assistance to families who are working, searching for employment, or are in training, and families who are enrolled in the Colorado Works program and need child care services to support their efforts toward self-sufficiency.

October is Cyber Security Awareness Month

October is National Cybersecurity Awareness Month, a time to raise awareness about online safety. Below are some of the best practices to help protect yourself and others:

- **Use Strong Passwords**: Create complex passwords with a mix of letters, numbers, and symbols. Use a password manager for secure tracking.
- Enable Two-Factor Authentication (2FA): Add extra security by using 2FA, like Mapleton's Microsoft Azure MFA, which sends a second verification code.
- Watch for Phishing Attempts: Be cautious with suspicious emails. Verify the sender, avoid unknown links, and report phishing attempts to IT.
- **Keep Software Updated**: Regularly update your system. Mapleton automatically provides updates, so schedule time to complete them without interruption.
- Secure Devices: Lock screens and ensure your Wi-Fi is secure when working remotely.
- Browse Safely: Only use secure websites and limit the sharing of personal information.
- **Report Suspicious Activity**: Immediately notify the <u>Help Desk</u> if you encounter anything unusual.


To help you save energy, here are some simple tips:

"Where is Mapleton?" story series debuts tomorrow

"Where is Mapleton?"

If you live, work, or attend school in Mapleton, this is a question you are likely asked a lot.

Mapleton is not a sprawling county. It's not a town on any Colorado map, and it's no longer a neighborhood of family truck farms. But Mapleton *is* a very special place to be.

Mapleton Public Schools is located in the "heart" of metro Denver. It's likely many people who don't know where Mapleton is drive through it every day, as Mapleton is where major Colorado arteries, including Interstate 25, Highway 36, Interstate 270, and Interstate 76, converge.

Mapleton Public Schools, originally known as Adams County District 1, is said to have gotten its name from the maple trees that lined Washington Street generations ago. At a modest 25 square miles, partially in Thornton and partially in Denver, the district boundaries are Huron, Zuni, and Franklin Streets on the west, 52nd Avenue on the south, and Colorado Boulevard on the east. On the north side, the boundary reaches as far as 108th Avenue in one small area.

Although Mapleton might not be a place on the map, our graduates, students, current staff, and retirees continue to put Mapleton on the map by making a lasting mark, achieving their dreams both globally and within the district.

Gifted and Talented professional learning courses available in October and November

The deadline to register for the Culturally and Linguistically Diverse Gifted Learners has been extended through tomorrow, Wednesday, Oct. 9. This 22.5-hour course starts with an in-person introductory session on Thursday, Oct. 10, from 4:30-6:30 p.m., in the Administration Building's Trail Ridge Training Center.

Only the first meeting is in-person; the rest of the course is completed asynchronously online via Canvas. This course also qualifies for CLD relicensure hours for those teachers still needing to meet the 45-hour requirement. This course can be used for standard relicensure credit and/or salary advancement. Optional graduate level credit can be purchased through Adams State University.
