Many of our elementary math classrooms have shifted to a Guided Math Classroom approach where the student drives much of the learning and is an active participant in each part of the lesson. In Guided Math, after a short teacher-led lesson, the class breaks up into small groups and begins to work in one of four stations: game, fluency, technology, and teacher. Students who are struggling with a concept may get more direct instruction and support with the problem set whereas the children who mastered the concept quickly, will be enriched with challenging situations and problems that extend their thinking beyond the lesson.
