

Formative Assessment	Summative Assessment
Formative assessment involves regular checks on student learning throughout a course. Teachers use quick assessments to gauge understanding and to provide feedback. These assessments contribute to a student's grade while helping identify and address problems early. This approach improves instruction and student performance by tracking progress continuously rather than relying solely on final exams.	Summative assessments are big tests or projects given at the end of a learning period to check how much a student has learned overall. Teachers use these assessments to give grades. Think of summative assessments as a "final score" that shows what students know after all the learning is done.
