Operating Levy Proposal

If the operating levy is approved, the additional funds would bolster the district's financial stability and enable investments in academic programs and services directly aligned with our new Strategic Plan, which was developed with community input. Please note that these are proposed expenses for consideration. Costs and salaries/benefits may vary due to fluctuations in prices over time.

The above estimates represent an example of year-one investments. If the levy proposal is approved by voters, the district will develop a 10-year plan. A Referendum Oversight Committee will be established and tasked with monitoring the implementation of levy measures.
