**What is your favorite food?** Buffalo Wings. I like spicy stuff and they are always something that can dip with them. I love the Anchor Bar in Buffalo.

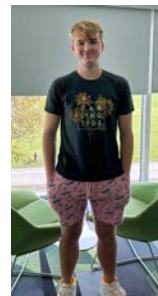
**What is your favorite drink?** Just Ice Cold Water! I try to stay hydrated.

## Teacher Spotlight

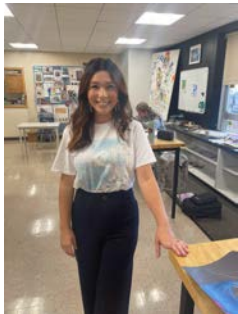

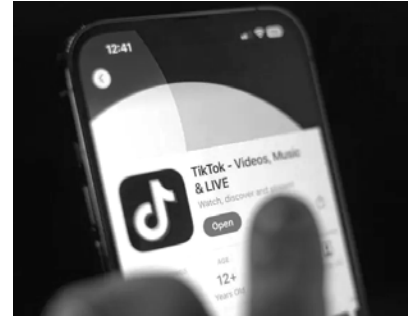

### **TikTok Taken to Court**

The idea that TikTok is addictive to kids and teens is not a new one. Studies from as early as 2019 have been published about the platform's addictive design. TikTok's For You page, in particular, has been shown to exploit the human

body's dopamine production in order to keep users scrolling. TikTok challenges have in some cases been even more harmful to America's youth: chroming, which may have started out as a joke, has claimed the lives of at least four children. As of this Tuesday, October 8, the



District of Columbia and fourteen states, including New York, have sued over these tragedies.

The US already began the process of banning TikTok in America earlier

this year, though not for the same reason. Due to national security concerns over the possibility of TikTok selling US user data to the Chinese government, in April, the Biden administration, backed by both parties, signed into law a bill stating that TikTok would be removed from American app stores if ByteDance does not sell the app to an American company by this upcoming January. These new lawsuits brought forward by the different states are unrelated to this national ban.

The lawsuits seek to prosecute TikTok for three things: the harm done to American youth, sexual exploitation of minors, and TikTok Coins. Officials say that TikTok LIVE has been used as a "virtual strip club" without any enforced age restrictions. TikTok Coins, the service through which TikTok users can tip livestreamers, are an unlicensed virtual currency since TikTok is not registered as a money transmitter through the United States Treasury Department, which is also a crime. For all of these reasons, most of the 15 lawsuits being brought against TikTok are seeking financial penalties and for TikTok to give up revenue from ads that target pre-teen users.

## Supreme Court Upholds Texas Abortion Ban

This Monday, October 7, the US Supreme Court upheld a decision from this January stating that emergency abortions cannot be required in the state of Texas. Texas has notoriously strict abortion laws, banning all abortions with only one exception: if the pregnant person is at risk of death or “substantial impairment of a major bodily function.” If this ban is violated, both the pregnant person and their doctor could face prison sentences and fines of at least \$100,000, and the doctor will also lose their medical license.

Under this law, the doctor is still required to try to save the fetus, and “substantial impairment of a major bodily function” is not defined under Texas law. Between this uncertainty and the threat of jail time, many Texas doctors have not been willing to perform even emergency abortions.

The Biden administration argued that under federal law which requires doctors to treat all patients in medical distress, emergency abortions are not only permitted but required. However, the state of Texas sued over this guidance, saying that doctors could not be required to provide an abortion if it is against Texas law. The Biden administration took this case all the way to the Supreme Court, who ruled in Texas’s favor. This means that, in the state of

Texas, doctors can deny a pregnant person life-saving medical care if they are unsure of the legality of the abortion.

The strike targeting Beirut and southern Lebanon on Thursday killed approximately 9 people in Beirut. More than 1300 people in Lebanon have been killed and about 1 million of Lebanon's residents have been displaced and evacuated from their homes and places since the Israel and Hezbollah war has started up more, filling up shelters beyond their capacity. The target at Hezbollah's executive council Hashem Safieddine is currently unclear if the strike killed Hashem.

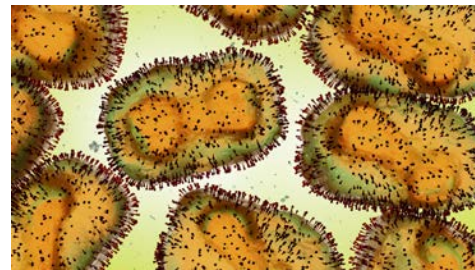
These hurricanes are all very different but are all dangerous. Hurricane Milton is the stronger currency out of all 3 hurricanes. Milton has clocked in at over 75 miles per hour, The hurricane is currently at a category 5. Which is even stronger than Helene. This hurricane is the most known as of right now. The 2 strongest is Kirk which is a category 3 hurricane. Hurricane Leslie is the hurricane that is the weakest and the least known about. These Hurricanes are also all formed at different places on the map. Hurricane Milton is more down south of the map, Kirk is more up north and Leslie is in the middle of Milton and Leslie right below Florida.

Since hurricane Milton is the strongest of the 3 hurricanes and has the highest wind speed it is expected that it will cause the most damage. This damage is going to be worse than Helene damage was. People are being ordered to leave their homes because of this Hurricane. This hurricane is taking a very similar route to hurricane Helene. But Leslie has less strength than Helene but is picking up warm water from the ocean and this could change very fast and gain more power and speed.

## Mpox Spreads in Africa

Monkeypox, now known as Mpox, has recently spread throughout Africa, resulting in a declaration of a global emergency. The Democratic Republic of Congo (DRC) has started



producing and providing vaccines for the disease. The DRC, with about 30,000 suspected Mpox cases

and 859 deaths, accounts for more than 80% of all the cases and 99% of all the deaths reported in Africa this year. All of the central African country's 26 provinces have recorded Mpox cases.

While a majority of the recorded cases are from children and teens, the doses are being provided for adults only, under a risk warning from the World Health Organization. The DRC is willing to provide vaccination formulas to other countries, with Japan signing up for a shipment within the next couple of weeks.

A series of wildfires in Portugal have begun and the cause of these wildfires started in a very peculiar manner. The Tasmanian blue gum is an ideal tree for commercial cultivation because it's faster-growing, has a larger amount of fiber,



and produces more pulp than most other species. That means it can be made into high-quality paper and tissue efficiently and economically. The problem is

because of these qualities the eucalyptus trees are particularly flammable and with the planet's heat rising due to global warming, this becomes incredibly dangerous. As the Portuguese paper and timber industries grew in the mid-1900s, so too did eucalyptus plantations, and the species now covers nearly 2 million acres. This has begun to result in the burning of these trees and massive forest fires taking down wildlife for thousands of acres and even resulting in a wildfire engulfing a highway and cutting off the top half of the country from the bottom resulting in the death of Nine people.

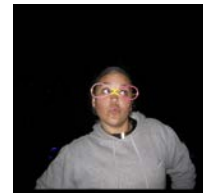

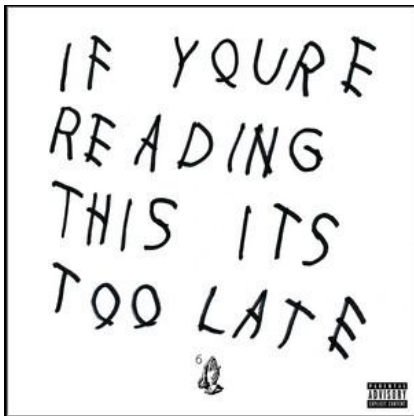

This week's review will be on the album *If You're Reading This It's Too Late* (IYRTITL) by Aubrey Drake Graham, globally known as *Drake*. Or by his nicknames “Drizzy” “6

God” “Champagne papi” or just “The boy”.

Drake's *If You're Reading This It's Too Late* (IYRTITL), released in 2015, marked a pivotal moment in his career. Moving away from his emotional, introspective style, this project introduced a more aggressive, confident side of Drake. Tracks like “Legend” and “Energy” show him grappling with fame and those trying to drain his success. Songs such as “Know Yourself” became iconic, particularly the now-famous line “running through the 6 with my woes.” The mixtape maintains a strong, cohesive sound, dominated by hard-hitting, trap-influenced beats, largely thanks to producers like Boi-1da and 40.

Despite the aggressive tone, Drake's vulnerability shines on songs like “You & The 6,” where he reflects on his relationship with his mother and the pressures of fame. While some fans were taken aback by the shift, IYRTITL has been praised for its boldness, solidifying Drake's status as one of hip-hop's elite. This album,

though different from past works like *Take Care*, and *Nothings* demonstrates his evolution as an artist.
