In 2024, Henry M. Gunn High School was ranked #53 nationally and #3 in California by Niche, making it one of the top public high schools in the state (Niche). Additionally, it ranks #1 in the San Francisco Bay Area for public high schools and college prep. These accolades highlight Gunn's strong academic foundation, making it a premier institution for high-achieving students.

Located 35 miles south of San Francisco and 14 miles north of San Jose in Santa Clara County, Palo Alto is a community of approximately 66,955 residents. Palo Alto is also neighbors to Stanford University and an excellent community college, Foothill College. 

SELF: (Social-Emotional Literacy & Functionality)

SELF is a non-graded 4-year comprehensive weekly program for every Gunn student participates in weekly. As students develop the core SEL competencies – social awareness, self-management, self-efficacy, selfawareness, social management, and social engagement - students build community and share stories with a trusted adult mentor and each other, guided by specific themes each semester like equity and empathy, selfidentity, and building relationships.

Alternative Programs

Gunn offers several alternative programs such as AVID, Social Justice Pathway, College Pathway (first-generation students), Business Pathway, Foothill Middle College, and College Now. Also, there are several Dual Enrollment programs that include Sports Medicine, Stage Tech, and Multivariable Calculus.
