DRESS CODE CLARIFICATON

Hello SIMS Families,

Stayton Intermediate/Middle School wants to ensure that students' dress is appropriate for the school setting. Students' dress should be modest, neat, and clean to ensure that our learning environment is comfortable for all students.

The following standards have been developed from the district to guide students and families in making sure that clothing choices are appropriate for school:

- 1. Dress and grooming shall be clean, in keeping with proper health, safety and sanitary practices; this includes always wearing shoes in school.
- 2. The dress and grooming of students shall not cause a substantial disruption to the teaching and learning process (distractions due to the type of clothing).
- 3. Any clothing deemed to be gang-affiliated or gang- related paraphernalia will not be allowed.
- 4. Clothing which has pictures of or references to alcohol, firearms, or drug-related clothing will not be allowed at school. Students are also not allowed to wear anything that promotes racial harassment or racial discrimination.
- 5. Clothing should be modest in nature in every school setting, including sporting events.

In addition to the district standards, SIMS has established the following guidelines for students that are NOT allowed on our campus:

- hoods on the head while inside a building may not be worn
- bandanas of any sort
- wallet chains (heavy chains connected to a wallet)
- clothing with holes above the knee (may be allowed if worn over leggings, tights or spandex)

Please remember that the dress expectations apply to all after-school activities, including dances.

I want to be clear around a couple of key terms used in the district clothing guidelines.


- 1. Modesty, and how it applies to all students. This term when related to clothing would be halter tops, crop tops, tube tops, muscle shirts, backless shirts, any see-through attire and/or clothing that exposes undergarments or midriffs.
- 2. The second term is when clothing is deemed to be a substantial disruption to the educational process. Remember, students and staff come to school each day to create an environment that needs to be conducive to learning. Clothing fashion that is appropriate in certain circumstances outside of the school setting is not always appropriate at school. If a student is not following expectations, they will be asked to change or to wear additional clothing. If necessary, families will be contacted so that the student may make arrangements to change into school appropriate clothing.

Please remember that students attending SIMS are not required to dress down for PE. In addition, all students, even in the seventh and eighth grade, have recess. An item of clothing that, when sitting at one's desk, is appropriate may not be appropriate for PE or recess when students are moving their bodies.

Please know that we are here to work with both students and families to ensure that everyone feels safe and comfortable within the school's learning environment.

Thank you for your time and energy in helping us create this learning environment.
