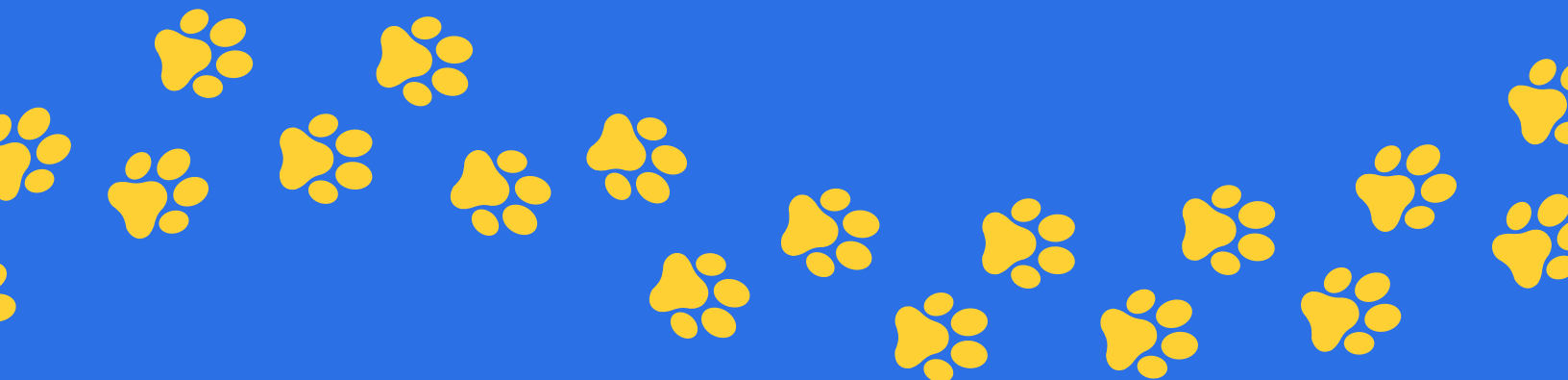

On September 26, fifth and sixth grades will be going to the SC Museum in Columbia. We are looking forward to a STEAM class and planetarium show. CogAT Testing is quickly approaching October 15-18 in grades (3-6). Students are referred by teachers and parents to take the assessment. Referrals are due by Sept. 27. In grades three and four, guest speakers will visit our classroom on October 30 to demonstrate experimental archaeology hands-on activities including making cordage and pump drills using craft supplies. In addition, third and fourth grade students will be going to the Schiele Museum November 6. They will need to bring a bag lunch or order one from the cafeteria. MERIT students in grades (4-6) will present The Fallen Soldier Table during the Veteran's Day program on November 8.



Nurse



District Medication Policy

1. Medication must be brought to the school nurse by a responsible adult. (Do not send with a child.)
2. Medication should be administered by a parent/guardian before or after school hours, when possible.
3. All prescribed medications must be provided to the school in a current, original labeled container issued by the pharmacist who filled the prescription and accompanied a District form, signed by parent and physician.
4. Starting doses of a medication that a child has never taken before should not be given first at school.
5. Over-the-counter medications should be brought to the school nurse by a parent in a new, un-opened bottle. A form will be provided for the parent to complete.

Immunization Certificates

If your child had any vaccinations at their physician's office or Health Department over the summer; please send in a copy of their up-dated South Carolina Certificate of Immunization. Completed certificates should be printed by the physician's office or Health Department. It also must be signed by someone at that office.

All students are required to have an up-dated S.C Certificate of Immunization indicating proof of the TDaP vaccine on file prior to beginning 7th grade. Any questions regarding the status of your child's vaccinations should be directed to your child's physician or Health Department.

Guidance



School has gotten off to a great start! In classroom guidance, students are learning about the connection of colors and feelings. We even did a little “magic” to demonstrate this. They learned how to manage angry feeling appropriately, the difference in Big and Little Deals and how to respond appropriately.

Students are also learning the importance of a positive can-do mindset! Students learn that mindsets are built slowly, over time, from the beliefs we have about ourselves, others, the world around us, and what we are able to do. They learned specific strategies for developing positive, can do mindsets.

Students are encouraged to wear Orange October 16th for Unity Day. Unity Day is an annual even occurring during National Bullying Prevention Month in October that promotes joining together to create healthier communities through kindness, acceptance, and inclusion. It was started by PACER’S National Bullying Prevention Center in 2011 and is now celebrated around the world.

Red Ribbon Week will be October 28th–Nov.1. This year marks the 36th anniversary of the first official celebration of Red Ribbon Week. The even has grown into the country’s largest anti-drug endeavor. Encouraging youngster to turn away from drugs is still the main emphasis, but giving them the tools to make other healthy choices is now a component. Classroom guidance lessons will focus on preventing bullying and making good choices for ourselves and others.

- Oct. 29th Tuesday: Don’t Get Mixed Up in Drugs–Wear Mismatched socks and/or clothes
- Oct. 30th Wednesday: Be ALL YOU can be...Drug Free–Wear Camouflage or Green and Brown
- Oct. 31st Thursday: Drugs and a Trick, Not a Treat–Wear Costumes (Nothing scary, no masks/props)
- Nov.1st Friday: Don’t let Drugs Sneak up on You–Wear sneakers or your favorite shoes

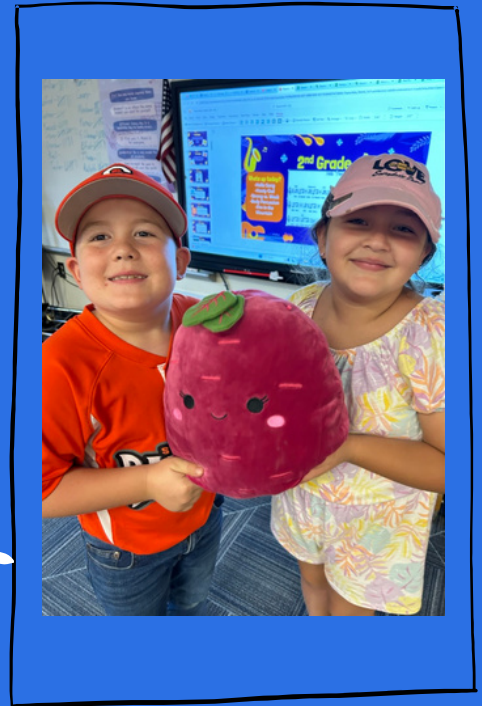
