Community Input Themes

1. Expand access to **high-quality schools close to home**
2. Create clear **educational pathways**, pre-K to graduation
3. Reduce the number of **transitions** between schools
4. Address **shifting enrollment patterns** in upper elementary and middle grades
5. Improve the **physical condition** of interior spaces: classrooms, cafeterias, libraries, bathrooms, auditoriums, gymnasiums, etc.
6. Modernize buildings with **instructional technology**
7. Ensure full **accessibility** for students with disabilities

The BuildBPS Plan Design Considerations

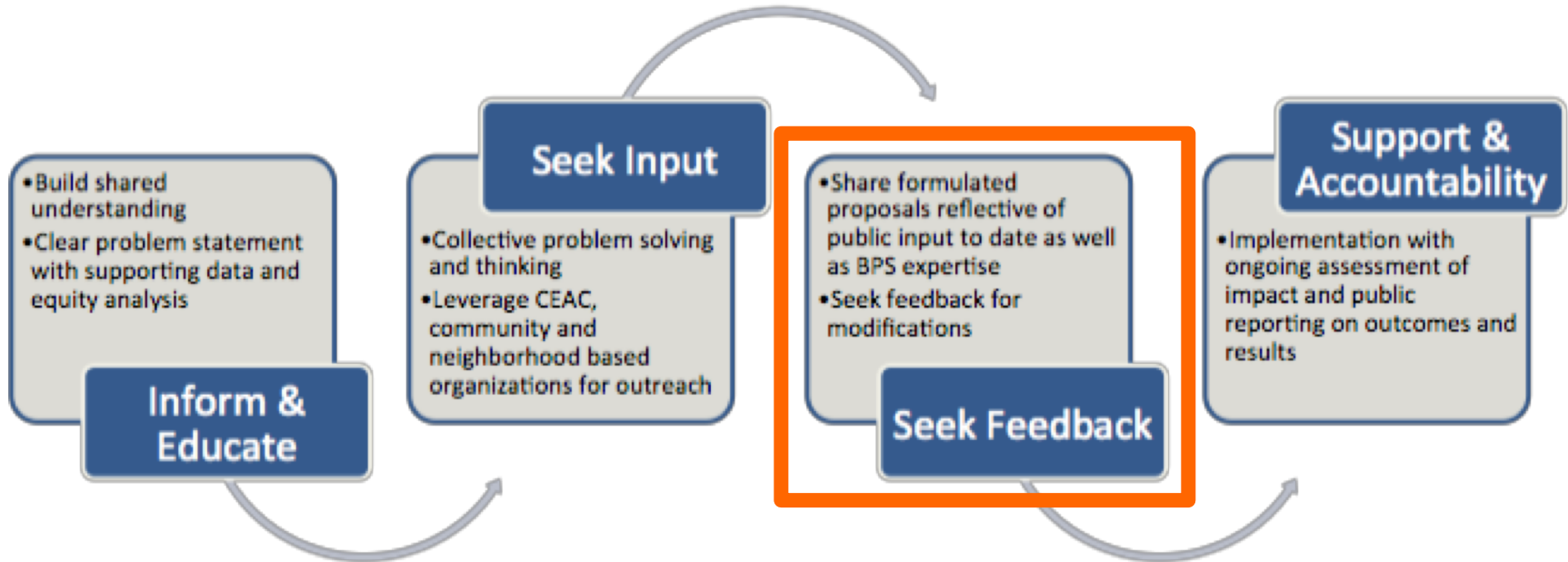
A proposed systemic 10 year plan, in multiple phases, to transform the BPS facilities landscape in a way that fosters the conditions for 21st century learning. Our emerging plan considers:

- Data and community input that inform decisions
- Values and principles that drive the thinking
- Operational and enrollment feasibility
- Improved program alignment to the needs of more students
- Improved physical quality & reduced deferred maintenance in buildings
- Greater specificity in the near term and more flexibility and variation in later stages

BuildBPS Values & Approach

1. Increase equity by prioritizing both facility and program alignment
2. Target expansions and new builds where most needed
3. Better concentrate funds to invest in quality for students
4. Minimize instability and uncertainty for the most vulnerable students
5. Reduce transitions and increase predictability for families through grade reconfiguration
6. Integrate unplanned facility issues into long term planning
7. Use the BuildBPS Planning Principles as a guide

Community Engagement Framework



BuildBPS Community Engagement and Communications Plan

Inform, educate and generate a healthy discussion about BuildBPS with a full range of stakeholders.

- Town Halls
- Small group meetings
- School-based meetings with School Parent Councils and School Site Councils
- Community and faith based organizations, district level parent advisory councils, and the Community Engagement Advisory Council co-hosting meetings
- Social and traditional media
- Ethnic media including radio, television and newspapers
- Door-knocking campaign
- Multilingual phonathons
- Rolling Bolling “Pop-Up” educational series

Community Engagement Advisory Council

The role of the CEAC is to help BPS in engage and leverage stakeholder voice and feedback to inform initiatives, policies and the district agenda

- Help refine and design the communications and engagement processes and campaigns
- Help identify and address gaps in stakeholder engagement and outreach
- Co-host public engagement opportunities and forums that serve as safe spaces for healthy dialogue
- Reach stakeholders in places and ways that are convenient and accessible to them
- Work with an eye to lift up traditionally silenced and marginalized voices
