	Reading of Communications: Secretary Filipiak reported that there were no communications.
	Citizens' Comments Pertaining to Agenda Items: There were no citizen's comments at this time.
	"In the Spotlight" – Student Representatives Aaron Welsh from the middle school and Amelia Jaynes from the high school both gave updates including past, current and upcoming events in their respective building.
	Special Presentation: Allen Park High School Athletics Handbook Mr. Victor provided the board with a draft of the athletic handbook that he has been working on in order to get input from the Extracurricular Committee before the board votes to adopt the handbook. Mr. Victor said that his goal is to create a handbook that all coaches, players and parents can use a guide for sports in the district. Mr. Victor also gave an update as to what has been happening with high school sports.
	Special Presentation: Early Childhood Program Update Mrs. Roller provided an update with regard to the early childhood programming in the district. She explained the state funded Great Start Readiness Program and that we will be receiving the funding for this program in July and will be able to advertise after that. We now offer half day preschool but want to expand that to offer full day for both 3 & 4-year olds and in the process of finalizing the licensing at Riley. Parents can apply for the tuition-based program and be moved to GSRP if they are qualified. Most everyone who applies should qualify.

Special Presentation: Academic Update

Dr. John Tafelski presented his winter update and said that as a follow-up to his spring update. Now is the time to see what we need to keep the same and what we need to change. MTSS is being assessed and we need to make sure that students are comfortable in their learning process.

The NWEA results were discussed showing areas that stayed the same, exceeded last year's results or maybe fell a little short. The idea is to analyze these figures and determine where things need to change. Going forward, the focus remains on small group instruction and how to help those students who may be struggling.

Data dive meetings are taking place to see how many students are progressing enough to be exited from the MTSS program.
