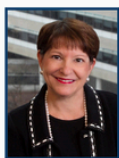

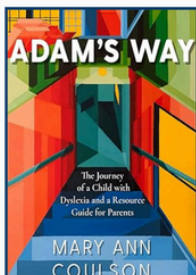

Since 1995, Heidi has been an integral member of The Gow School Community.

In addition to teaching for nearly 30 years, Heidi met her husband, Rick Hausauer, a longtime member of Gow's Buildings and Grounds team on campus. They have two children, Alexa and Ethan, and live in East Aurora.

Heidi serves as the Chair of the Applied Technology Department and a teacher of broadcast journalism, 3-D art, and audio and video production. In addition to teaching classes, she is the yearbook editor and coaches the girls' dance team. Two years ago, Heidi received the Lowell "Link" Lundell Award for Excellence in Teaching. Chosen by colleagues, this is the highest honor bestowed to a Gow faculty member.

With a B.S. from Nazareth College and an M.S. Ed. from Buffalo State University, she loves challenging her students to think creatively, explore new ideas, and plan for their futures. "I enjoy teaching my video classes because those students are visual and spatial learners. They think in pictures, and what is a movie but a series of pictures in motion? At Gow, we help students discover what inspires them," Heidi explains. For those drawn to the arts, this discovery helps them succeed in college and beyond. Heidi knows firsthand the impact art, creativity, and thoughtful teaching can have on Govians." Our students are creative and skilled at overcoming challenges.
