

Welcome to October and National Bullying Prevention Month. One of the best ways to support bullying prevention as a caring adult in your school/LEA is to learn more about bullying; what it looks like, how to prevent it, how to respond, and how to support students. Research has shown that the training of school and central office staff is an essential element of any successful bullying prevention effort and when teachers and staff are trained to identify, prevent and respond to bullying behaviors, it can lead to a reduction of bullying allegations among students.

An Introduction to Bullying Prevention for Maryland Educators is an hour-long, non-credit course, designed to help educators better understand how to recognize and respond to bullying behaviors among students.

The course should take about an hour to complete and is asynchronous. Please feel free to take advantage of the tools that are offered in the course.

Module 1 provides educators with a better awareness of the bullying dynamic, including a definition of bullying, the types of bullying, Maryland laws, Maryland data, and why teacher efficacy matters when responding to bullying situations.

Module 2 offers strategies for Maryland educators to better address and respond to bullying situations, including building an infrastructure that supports bullying prevention, effectively responding, supporting students involved, and better understanding the barriers preventing students from reporting to adults.

The purpose of this program is to prepare and support classroom teachers in their work with multilingual learners. The four-course program introduces teachers/graduate students to foundations of multilingual learning and immigration experiences, to assessment and instruction with multilingual learners, to the linguistic bases of language and literacy development, and to school-community partnerships for immigrant families. Graduates will be better able to serve multilingual learners in classrooms and contribute to enhanced school and family community relationships.

Certificate and Endorsement:

- Completion of the program leads to Towson University Graduate Certificate in Teaching English Learners
- Coursework prepares teachers to pass the Praxis II ESOL Exam which, along with TRE Praxis, is required for MSDE TESOL Endorsement.
