
This week, we have been reviewing multi-digit multiplication in math. We have also been focusing on our basic facts. Having a solid foundation with facts will help when we move to division. Math facts are important building blocks for future math concepts. Knowing the basic facts will help students to estimate, solve larger problems, and use mental math. Students can practice using a variety of games or even online games

Sixth Graders just took their first test on the order of operations, also known as PEMDAS! We have now started working on applying the divisibility rules. The divisibility rules help students identify if large numbers are divisible by 1,2,3,4,5,6,9, or 10.



We found that...

A number is divisible by two if the one digit is even.

A number is divisible by three if the sum of the digits is divisible by 3.

A number is divisible by four if the number formed by the last two digits is divisible by 4.

A number is divisible by five if the digit in the one's spot is a 5 or 0.


A number is divisible by six if the number is divisible by both 2 and 3.

A number is divisible by nine if the sum of the digits is divisible by 9.

A number is divisible by ten if the digit in the one's spot is 0.


