Autumn is here! We are off to a great school year with a lot of learning in the classrooms! Teachers have completed all beginning of the year assessments for math and reading. Your child's reading results were sent home in a sealed while envelope.. Please call, message your child's teacher or schedule an appointment to discuss the results if you have any questions. Children will have a short assessment each month to monitor their reading goals. Teachers are strategic with planning both whole and small group lessons to meet the needs of all of their students. I encourage you to have your child read each day at home so that the reading skills they are being taught at school can be reinforced at home. Teachers may send home passages and books for your child to practice at home. The Silas Bronson Library is also another great place to borrow books so your child can practice reading at home.

In addition to the many things children have been learning since the start of the school year, each class is working on a project for Hispanic Heritage Month which is celebrated from September 15 – October 15. Ask your child what countries and/or famous people they are learning about through their class projects.

Be on the lookout for the monthly calendar of events. Each month, PTO, SGC and SELT meetings will be held. Our first PTO meeting will be held on Monday, October 7th at 6:30. The first SGC meeting will be immediately after this meeting at 6:45p.m. followed by our SELT meeting at 7:15 p.m. These meetings will be virtual. We will plan student activities and family events during these meetings.

As a reminder, students are still going outside for recess. Make sure to dress your child in layers so that they stay warm when they are outdoors. Please label all of their jackets, sweaters and lunch bags too! We are trying to avoid the "Lost and Found" bucket.

If your child has an appointment, please send them back to school immediately after the appointment so your child doesn't miss an entire day of learning. #### KINDERGARTEN

Happy fall! We have finished our beginning-of-year mCLASS and i-Ready testing.

We are starting Unit 1 of Benchmark, which focuses on plants and animals and what they need to survive. We are also integrating science into our reading and writing lessons. We are learning what it means to be a good reader and writer.

We are well into our first math unit of counting! We are practicing counting anything and everything. We are also learning to write numbers 1 - 10 and compare numbers 1 - 5.

Now that the weather is cooler, please send your child in a sweater or a long sleeved shirt, something that can be removed when the afternoon gets warm, but the morning is cool. Also remember hoodies are not allowed in school and students should not be wearing outside jackets in the classroom, but they need those for when they go outside. It is important your child knows how to remove their own sweater and put it back on. Kindergarten is very busy and independence is important. This attire should also be a solid color of navy blue, black, gray, or khaki.

FIRST GRADE

Happy Fall! We have finished our mClass reading assessments and will begin focusing on reaching our reading goals! We have also begun Unit 1 of Benchmark in which we will be learning about how animals and plants change and grow. In Math we are currently learning number partners for 10. We will also begin Science this month, learning about plants and animals.

As a reminder, the weekly homework packets are due on Fridays. We have also begun taking spelling tests on Fridays. Expect the list of words to be sent home each week and practice the words with your child each night.

Students may bring in a healthy snack and a water bottle each day. Please ensure that your child is dressed appropriately for the weather as it begins to get cooler outside. We are excited for this month of learning ahead!

SECOND GRADE

Welcome Fall! We have completed our mCLASS testing and our Math Diagnostic Assessment and now have been focusing on setting our goals for this school year.

In Math, we have been adding and subtracting to solve equations, finding unknown numbers, and using math strategies- number bonds, bar model, fact families, ten frames, and open number lines. We are learning how to solve one-step and two-step word problems, along with analyzing pictographs and bar graphs. We are also reviewing time (hour, minute, and counting by 5's) and money (coins-penny, nickel, dime, and quarter - how much are they worth? 1,5,10,25 cents)

In ECRI, we are working on reviewing and practicing short and long vowel sounds and spellings. We are also learning about contractions and affixes as well.

We will be starting our first science unit and learning about making observations of plants and animals to compare the diversity of life in different habitats.

Please remember to check your student's folder each night. As a reminder, please send in a jacket or sweatshirt with the students with NO hood please. Healthy snacks and water bottles can be sent each day as well. Please no soda or any snacks with peanuts.

Happy Fall! Happy October! This month it's time to focus on how to reach our goals.

Students have set goals in reading that they want to accomplish by the end of the year. Students really need to fill their world with lots of words. Please read a book each night and ask students to read aloud at least one page. Read words everywhere you go. We are starting unit 1 of Benchmark. During this unit we will be working on learning about Animals while learning about skills and strategies used in reading.

In Math, we will be finishing Unit 1 - Place Value, Addition and Subtraction of Three-Digit Numbers. In October we will begin Unit 2 - Multiplication and Division: Concepts, Relationships, and Patterns. Our students will also set their Math goals for the year based on the results of the iReady Beginning-of-Year Diagnostic.

Students need to focus on their learning now that September is over. Homework is assigned on Monday and due on Friday. Students should be in the habit of bringing home their folders every night, cleaning them out, and returning them the next day. Please remind students to keep their toys at home as our focus needs to be on the curriculum.

Now that the weather is cooler, please send in a sweater or a long sleeved shirt, something that can be removed when the afternoon gets warm, but the morning is cool. Please remember hoodies are not allowed in school and students should not be wearing outside jackets in the classroom. They need those for when they go outside. This attire should also be a solid color of navy blue, black, gray, or khaki.

In ELA, we are excited to use our new Benchmark program. The students are currently working on explanatory essays about woodpeckers and learning about how we respond to the natural world around us. As always, students are working on their oral reading fluency and have just finished mClass testing. Results have been sent home.

Finally, in science, we are learning about animal structure and function and how our bodies work. Thank you for all your support! Please feel free to contact us if you have any questions.

For Math, we just finished up volume and are moving on to multiplying multi-digit numbers. Students are practicing different strategies to multiply. Students are also working on their multiplication fluency skills every day. Please practice fact fluency at home every night!

In Science, we are learning how organisms interact and how their needs are met.

In ELA, we are starting our first unit of Benchmark. Students are learning about cultivating natural resources, and will begin writing an explanatory essay about the structure of a corn plant.

As a reminder, 20 minutes of reading every day will help your child improve his/her reading fluency. Weekly homework packets will continue each week. These are due on Fridays!

Now that we have completed our beginning-ofthe-year mCLASS reading benchmark assessments, the staff will be looking at the data to rearrange our reading intervention and small groups. Our tutor, Mrs. Byrnes, and Reading Teacher, Mrs. Pronovost, will continue to take reading intervention groups daily for 45 minutes. A few students may move between us or return to see their teachers for additional reading support.

All students who see Mrs. Pronovost for intervention will bring home a plastic folder each night. 10 minutes of reading is recommended each night. I will be sending home a reading log for grades 1-5 that needs to be filled out. The logs are checked on Fridays. New prizes have been ordered for those who complete their reading log each week.

With the cooler weather it's a great time to pull up a blanket and snuggle in with a good book.

#### Happy Fall!

- During the month of October, students will continue working on Unit 1 of Benchmark. It is a new program that includes four components; Reading, Writing, Speaking and Listening, intensively. Students seem to be eager to learn and practice these components.
- Kindergarten grades are learning letters, (recognizing, reading and writing them). They are also learning about animals and their needs.
- In first grade students are studying living things and how they change while growing.
- Second graders are studying the life cycle of the animals. They're also practicing reading and writing.
- In third grade students are learning how animals are adapting to the environment. They are practicing turn and talk methods in order to improve oral communication.
- Fourth grade students are learning about nature and working on explanatory essays.
- In fifth grade students are learning the process of Cultivating Natural Resources, analyzing the stories and practicing writing.
