Building A Brighter Future Updates

After eight months of extensive community engagement and input, the Bedford City School District's Design Team submitted the Building a Brighter Future Schematic Design for the new Middle School and PreK-2 buildings to the Ohio Facilities Construction Commission (OFCC) for review.

The submission is the result of a comprehensive community engagement and input process that included engaging internal and external stakeholders to understand perceptions. An all-day Visioning Session with a broad cross-section of our communities provided initial feedback. The Visioning Report then helped shape additional input opportunities, including: stakeholders, the Board of Education, Pre-K – 2 staff, Middle School staff, a Town Hall public meeting, a Visual Preference Survey, and an ECO-charrette (lengthy, detailed interactive brainstorming session that generates goals for a project) to define sustainability goals.

The Design Team received feedback from nearly 1,000 stakeholders in creating the OFCC submission. The Construction Manager, Design team and OFCC is expected to review the plan for budget, educational appropriateness, and schedule. The Bedford City School District will continue engaging the community and staff throughout the fall.
