LETTER FROM OUR PRESIDENT

Looking Back and Looking Ahead

C SAGH leaders took time this summer to reflect on the previous year. This sounds like a simple exercise, but the discipline to take time to look back and evaluate both good and bad allows us to improve personally and as a community of Christian educators.

Our theme for last year was Be Transformed, so we were essentially asking—is there evidence of transformation? Paul says in Romans 12:2, "Do not be conformed to this world, but be transformed by the renewal of your mind, that by testing you may discern the will of God, what is good and acceptable and perfect." Looking back, we could see that our community was really energized by this theme. We saw lives changed, including students who accepted Jesus for the first time, and many students rededicated their lives to Christ! Praise the Lord for His goodness!

Last year was a year of accomplishments. Here are four highlights:

- A fall visit from the Association of Christian Schools International (ACSI) resulted in a seven-year renewal of our accreditation.
- We had the highest-ever enrollment at 920 students!
- Our new teachers and administrators had a strong year, resulting in more than 85% of teachers returning for the next year.
- CSAGH students completed 243 college courses in our new Dual Enrollment Program, where juniors and seniors can take up to 12 college credits per year paid by CSAGH. CSAGH graduates are a step ahead, with many saving almost a year of college tuition.

Looking back also gave us clarity for the year ahead. A new theme – Rooted in Christ – is helping us focus on pointing students to Jesus. Work continues on the 2023-2026 Enhance and Expand Capital Campaign, and we remain steadfast in increasing support for our teachers and students.

Our CSAGH graduates are the best of this generation and hold much promise to impact the world for Christ. Your support allows us to educate young students to know Christ and serve Him. For that, we thank you!

Lessons Taught, Lessons Learned

Kindergartners are in the formative years of their lives. They learn letters, sounds, shapes, times, seasons, and much more. At Harrisburg Christian School (HCS) and West Shore Christian Academy (WSCA), our kindergartners also learn who God is, that He loves them, and what that means for their lives.

HCS and WSCA students are surrounded by teachers who love Jesus and love sharing the gospel. Ms. Shughart, a kindergarten teacher at WSCA, said,

One of my favorite things about teaching at WSCA is that I can daily talk about Jesus and share the gospel with my students. There is no holding back the truth of God and His Word and we get to daily live that out together in our classroom community.

At CSAGH schools, we have five incredible kindergarten teachers who teach students the academic foundations for elementary school. But it's not just the teachers who are imparting knowledge in the classroom; our kindergarten students are also teaching valuable lessons to their teachers in many ways.

Our kindergartners are a reflection of the faith God calls us to have.

When asking our kindergarten teachers what lessons they have learned from students, Mrs. Palmquist, a kindergarten teacher at HCS, said, "In Matthew 18, Jesus reminds us to be like children. I love looking to my students because they are a great reminder to have faith like a child."

In Matthew 18, Jesus encourages His listeners to humble themselves like a child and receive Him like a child. However, having faith like a child is not easy. In Matthew 18:4, Jesus tells us, "So anyone who becomes as humble as this little child is the greatest in the Kingdom of Heaven." Having faith like a child requires

us to put aside our misconceptions so they do not get in the way of trusting Christ wholeheartedly.

Hebrews 11:1 tells us that "faith is confidence in what we hope for and assurance about what we do not see." Children are known for their pure belief and trust, and as Christians, we can learn something from them. Embracing a childlike faith means placing our confidence in Christ's promises, even in circumstances that are unclear.

Ms. Shughart shared another lesson she has learned from teaching kindergartners at WSCA,

One of the greatest lessons I have learned from my students is that we should be so eager to learn more about Jesus that we cannot contain ourselves. There is a hunger in little children for Jesus and the Word that we should desire to have as adults. Kindergartners love Jesus, and they spur me on to desire to know Him more, too.

Our vision statement at CSAGH is "Preparing students to impact the world for Christ." While our staff and faculty partner with families to provide Christ-centered education so students will impact the world for Christ, in many ways, our students are already making an impact.

Our kindergartners are impacting the world for Christ by the way they love and trust Jesus. They are also being equipped with the academic foundations for elementary school to be prepared for the calling God has on their lives.

HCS and WSCA kindergarten teachers utilize a variety of learning styles to help each student succeed. Mrs. Stonge, a WSCA kindergarten teacher, loves incorporating play into her classroom. She said,



"I utilize a variety of teaching strategies in my classroom to help meet each student's needs, but I personally prefer activities that involve songs, puppets, and costumes!"

When you step into a kindergarten classroom at HCS or WSCA, it's common to see our teachers singing songs, teaching through play, and serving as role models for impressionable minds.

At CSAGH schools, we partner with families to nurture young minds and hearts, and our kindergarten teachers are instrumental in achieving that. They prepare students with the academic foundations for elementary school and the spiritual building blocks of biblical truth. It is inspiring to watch our kindergarten students not only grow academically but also be reminders of how we should love and trust our Creator.




Student Life Highlights








J-Term 2024

Surgery Live! at the Whitaker Center

Many of the high school science students attended Surgery Live! at the Whitaker Center and watched a robotic gastric sleeve procedure. Doctors at the Penn State Health Milton S. Hershey Medical Center conducted the surgery, and it was streamed live to the Sunoco Theater HD screen. A second doctor was present at the Whitaker Center to explain the procedure and answer questions. The anatomy students completed the unit on the digestive system and were able to view the organs they studied. Students took this experience and knowledge and applied it to fetal pig dissections. They were also given insight into medical careers and the education needed to become a surgical technician, nurse, anesthesiologist, and surgeon. The program concluded with an informational video on organ donation.



As a reminder, the 2023-2026 Enhance and Expand Strategic Plan has four areas.

Innovation

We are working to innovate our curriculum, adding more technology and hands-on experiences that infuse 21 st-century skills that colleges and employers are looking for in our graduates. The outcome of this effort will be a maker space at all campus locations, a K-12 technology curriculum, and one device for every 6-12th grade student (1:1).

Connection

Involved and connected students are more likely to excel and benefit from our academic program.

Connection is also a focus of our spiritual life program as we point students to Jesus and give them the opportunity to increase their connection to their faith.

Enhance and Expand

As our schools grow and we enroll more mission-fit students and families, we are expanding facilities through the 2023-2026 Enhance and Expand Capital Campaign. The campaign goal is \$9.625 million. The first year was a success, with pledges and donations exceeding expectations.

Develop Our Faculty and Staff

Innovation requires teacher training in new skills. We are offering more professional development, advancement opportunities, and leadership options for our teachers. We are also increasing support for all employees so that we can retain our incredibly effective teachers and administrative teams.

Turn Your PA Tax Dollars into Student Scholarships

Through Educational Improvement Tax Credits

How it works:

You will make an upfront donation of \$1,000 or more, up to the amount of your annual state taxes. When you file your taxes in the spring you will receive a 90% refund of your donation from Pennsylvania and a federal tax deduction.

Donations are made through a Special Purpose Entity, a class of charity that exists solely to obtain PA Education Improvement Credits (EITC/OSTC). There are a limited number of credits available, so be sure to apply early.

How the money is used:

100% of your donations provide financial aid to Harrisburg Christian School or West Shore Christian Academy students that qualify for assistance based upon their family's income.

Who qualifies?

LLC, Partnership, S-Corp, or Individuals with a PA tax liability of \$1,000 or more.
