- 2. Staff: Cross Country team having a fantastic season, SMD students made signs for most recent meet, just recently had Progress Reports due recently, counselors doing a parent night and beginning push-ins for seniors to help with college apps, OHS student Beau Ogles up for Sacbee player of the week, teachers implementing BTC strategies learned at PD Day, overall student government and staff working together to build school spirit, OHS is communicating about social media threats (police have been investigating, no credible threat found, but important to continue to keep eyes open)

ELAC/PBIS: first ELD meeting, families who attended provided ideas about communication (e.g., preferred Remind over email) and presentation topics, N Haynes represented PBIS (positive behavior interventions and support) and described tiered system of support, explained how the PBIS team looks at data monthly and incorporates student and parent feedback, team is working on developing more formalized feedback strategy via SSC, PBIS team developed school cell phone policy and use of Minga for PBIS strategies, is seeing lots

VII. New Business (Information and/or Action)

1. Action: Review/Approve Bylaws

B Scheutz - is Parliamentarian position in the Bylaws

J Geluk - identified by name, but no duties listed

C Strawn added in the following duties for Parliamentarian:

M Buljan changed item 8D: Members shall abstain from voting on any matter when a conflict of interest arises *and/or were not present for the previous meeting, in regards to approving previous minutes* and 6E: *The Principal will work in collaboration with the Chairperson, Vice Chairperson and the Secretary*

K Reza motions to approve bylaws as amended, J Geluk seconds, all in favor

2. Action: Review/Approve SPSA Revisions (SPSA Doc and Changes)

M Buljan: this shows all of the money OHS receives and how it is allocated. Last SPSA approved in April, but new numbers have come in, affecting SPSA. The district has given us more money for Intervention for Math and Language Arts. CA Dashboard data has also come in and affected SPSA. SPSA is a living, breathing document and can be updated throughout the year.

Changes: see Changes document above.

M Buljan: we'd like to OK the site plan with the changes, SSC read over on their own, suggest any changes next meeting. SPSA must be approved by Monday.

K Reza: noticed Black students not specificially identified as a targeted subgroup on Page 31

M Buljan: Dashboard Data does officially report on specific subgroups when numbers are very small (e.g. only two American Indian students). Obviously students still matter.

K Reza: wants to voice concerns that students are being neglected if not specifically named.

K Reza: questions why SPSA says Hispanic, rather than Latin/Latinx, etc.

M Buljan: language aligns with state usage.

J Geluk: data always messy due to student and family reporting. Agree optics are awkward. Is there a generalized "catch all" language like "other identified students"

M Buljan: language has to be consistent with how state reports. Subgroup names come directly from the state.

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K Reza: observed that Latino is still used some places in SPSA.

M Buljan: we'll make sure terminology is consistent throughout the document.

M Buljan: no changes made to methods in achieving goals.

C Strawn: biggest change in funds was addition of \$17,000 from LCFF, will go towards student tutors during Fifth Period. Additional funding data coming in November, expect to make changes then.

K Reza motions, E Thorson seconds, all in favor, motion carries.

3. Action: Review/Approve Parent Engagement Policy

M Buljan: communicates that we involve parents and community members in terms of programs and money spent. We have this now that we are a full (rather than targeted) Title I school.

K Reza motions, B Schuetz seconds, all in favor, motion carries.
