Occupational Therapy Assistant - FALL 2024

PROGRAM OVERVIEW:

The purpose of this program is to prepare students to function as competent entry-level occupational therapy assistants in a variety of practice settings and to pass the National Board for Certification in Occupational Therapy (NBCOT) examination. Students will move through this program as a cohort. Some students will follow a traditional model of attendance at LBCC and others will follow a distance education (DE) model of accessing the Occupational Therapy Assistant (OTA) program-specific courses in real-time via the internet (see page 9). This is a 6-term, 91-92 credit program designed to be completed within 2 years. The curriculum includes classroom, laboratory, and fieldwork components. Students must complete Level II fieldwork within 15 months of completion of the classroom portion of the program and must fulfill all program requirements within 36 months of admission into the program. Depending on enrollment at distance sites or the availability of lab instructors, students may be required to travel to their lab site, which may or may not be at the nearest partner college. Students will travel out of their immediate geographic area to a location in the Pacific Northwest for fieldwork rotations. Students are responsible for all costs related to travel and/or temporary relocation for fieldwork and lab experiences.
