



Thornton Receives ASE Master Certification for the NAVISTAR Program!

Thornton Township District 205's Navistar Diesel Engine Program received recognition as a Master Diesel Program as "Master Truck Service Technology," the highest level of program accreditation recognized by the National Institute for Automotive Service Excellence (ASE). **District 205 is the only high school program in North America with this level of designation**. To maintain this accreditation status, District 205 participates in regular compliance reviews and inspections.

To receive this level of accreditation, all instructors are ASE Certified. Our instructors have nationally recognized ASE Master Certification.

This designation is important for our students because all transportation industries recognize that our certification indicates our students are prepared and have been trained in a fully accredited program.

Upon completion of the program our students are eligible to enter the workforce in a variety of lucrative pathways, but are specifically trained as truck technicians, diesel mechanics, service managers, heavy equipment technicians, power plant technicians, parts managers and more. Students will be assured of a quality education, and shop owners will be assured of getting quality job applicants.
