Illinois school license #015-000560 authorizes STUDIO 205 COSMETOLOGY AND BARBERINGto operate a cosmetology school at 15000 Cottage Grove Ave Dolton, IL 60419.

The school is approved to provide the 1500-hour Cosmetology program and the 1500 hour Barbering program. as set forth in the Rules for the Administration of the Illinois Barber, Cosmetology, Esthetics, Hair Braiding and Nail Technology Act of 1985 (Act). Language has been added to the Act to include a licensed school is a postsecondary educational institution authorized by the Department to provide a postsecondary education program.

A school may offer programs that exceed the minimum clock hour requirements defined by Rule. A school may offer a refresher course for each of the approved programs in accordance with the provisions of the Act. The school must remain in compliance with the provisions of the Act for the duration of its existence.





Huge shout out to Amira Hondras for making IHSA history by being the 1st girl to pitch an opening day complete game on the varsity level!






