Thornton High School 2023 testing results:


IB Diplomas:

Thornton High School 2023 Other Information

IB graduates have now been accepted to: Northwestern, Harvard, Yale, Stanford, USC, UCLA, New York University, Princeton, Vanderbilt, Purdue, University of Illinois, LSU, Mizzou, Howard, North Carolina A&T and many more.

Currently there are 3 students at Princeton and 2 at Stanford!

We now have 17 teachers fully trained and using IB strategies both in their IB courses and in their non-IB courses. We added IB Biology as an option for this year and are adding IB Computer Science for next year to give students even more options within the program.

2023 Thornwood Exam and IB Facts:

 70% of the Thornwood full diploma students earned college credit at least one or more IB course.

 14 students passed the IB Spanish class with two perfect scores. Other course highlights are English as well as our Psychology course that had strong results.

 Continue to build community relations with our sender schools through our IB science classes and efforts of the teachers and students.

15 teachers fully trained in their IB content area



Breakdown of Budgeted Revenues by Source




Budgeted Expenditures – All Funds




Breakdown of Budgeted Expenditures by Type




Major Positive Factor Impacting Financial Condition Increasing Evidenced-Based Funding Revenues
