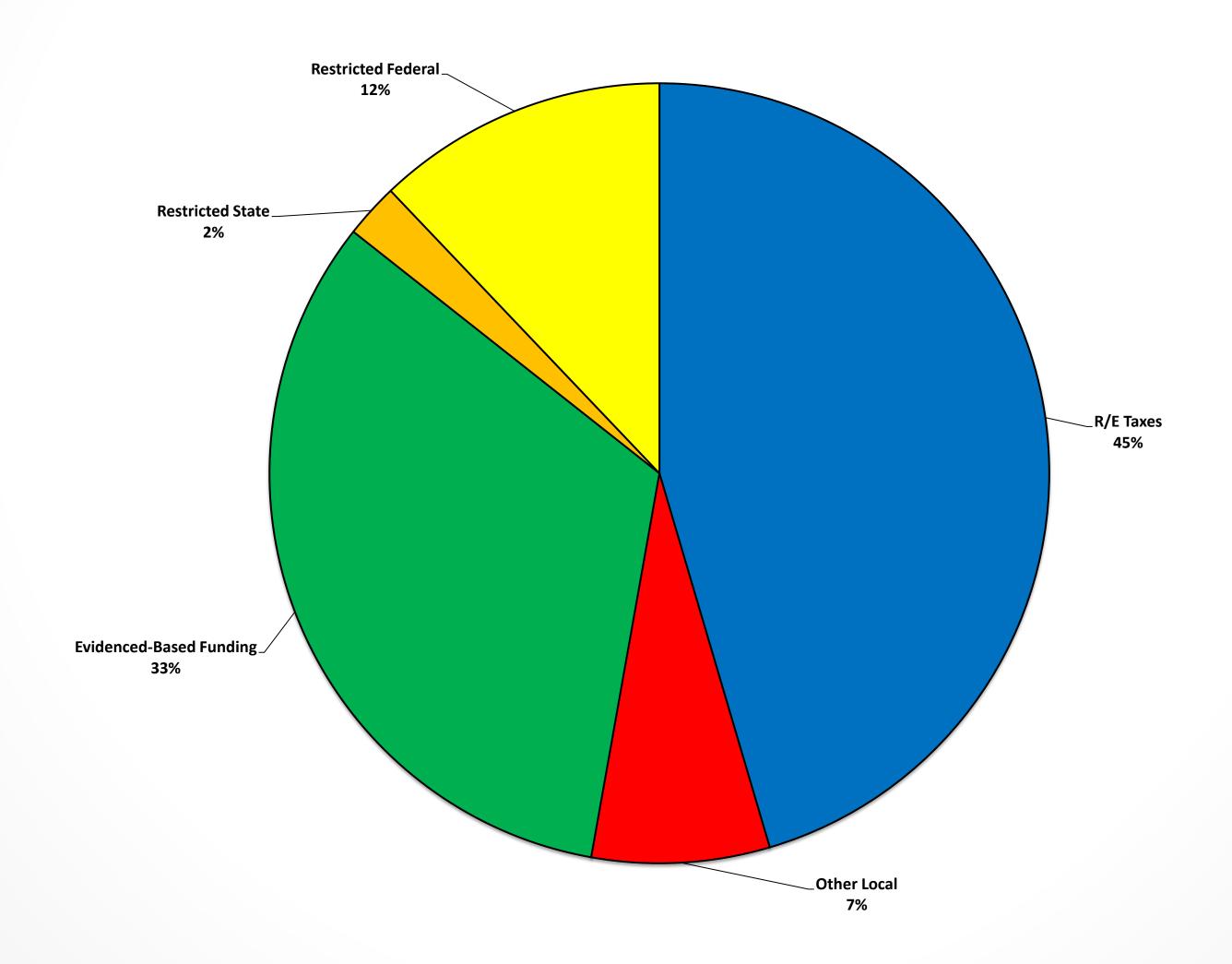

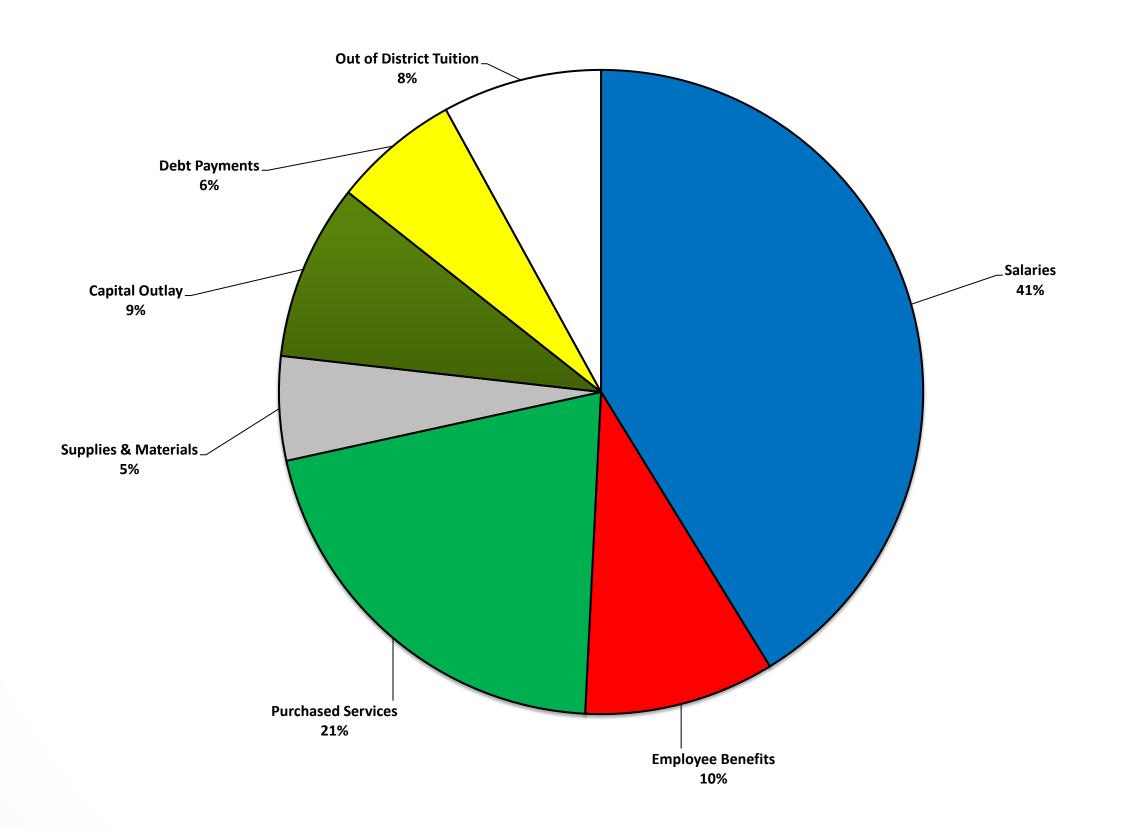

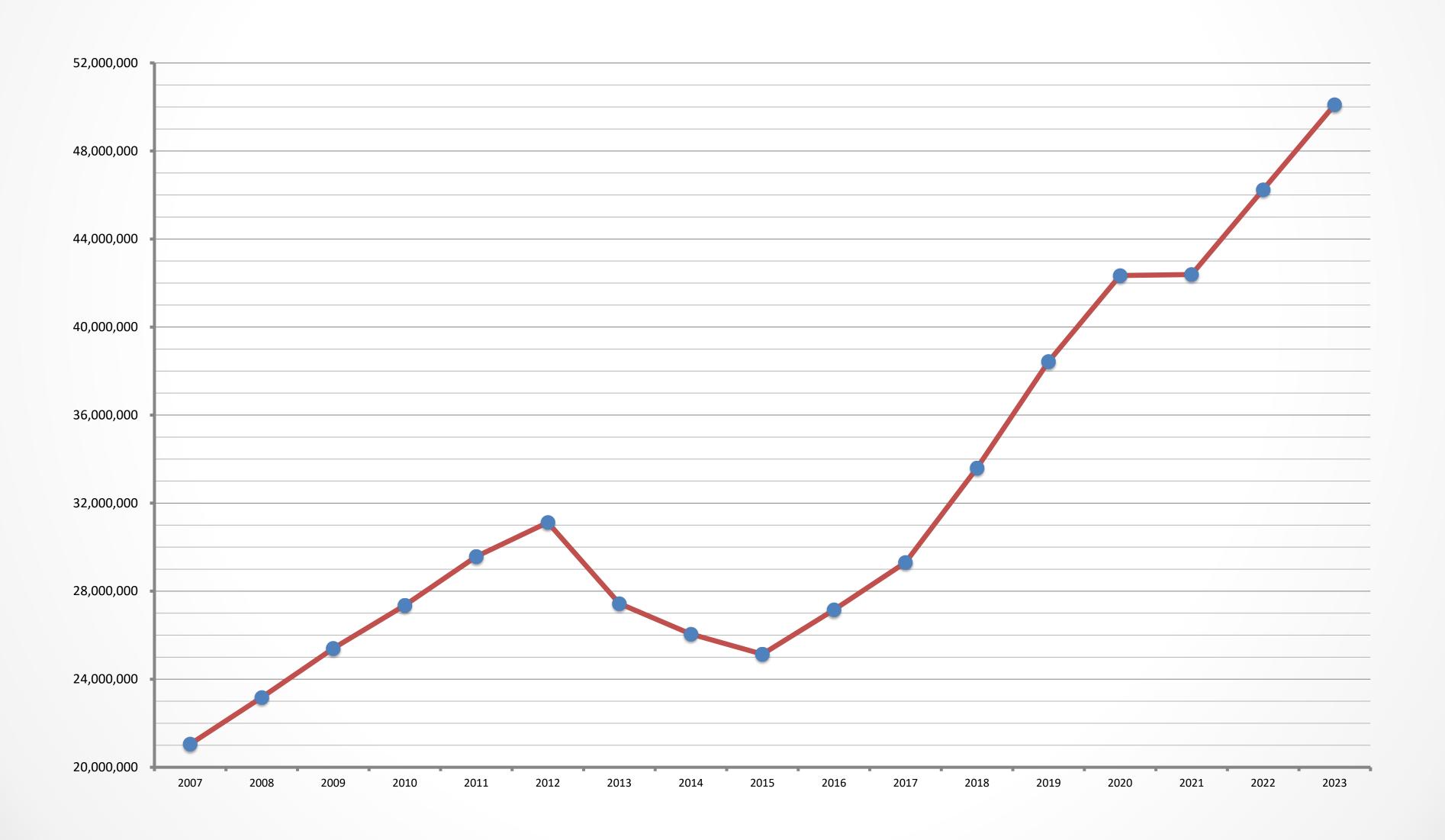

#### Breakdown of Budgeted Expenditures by Type

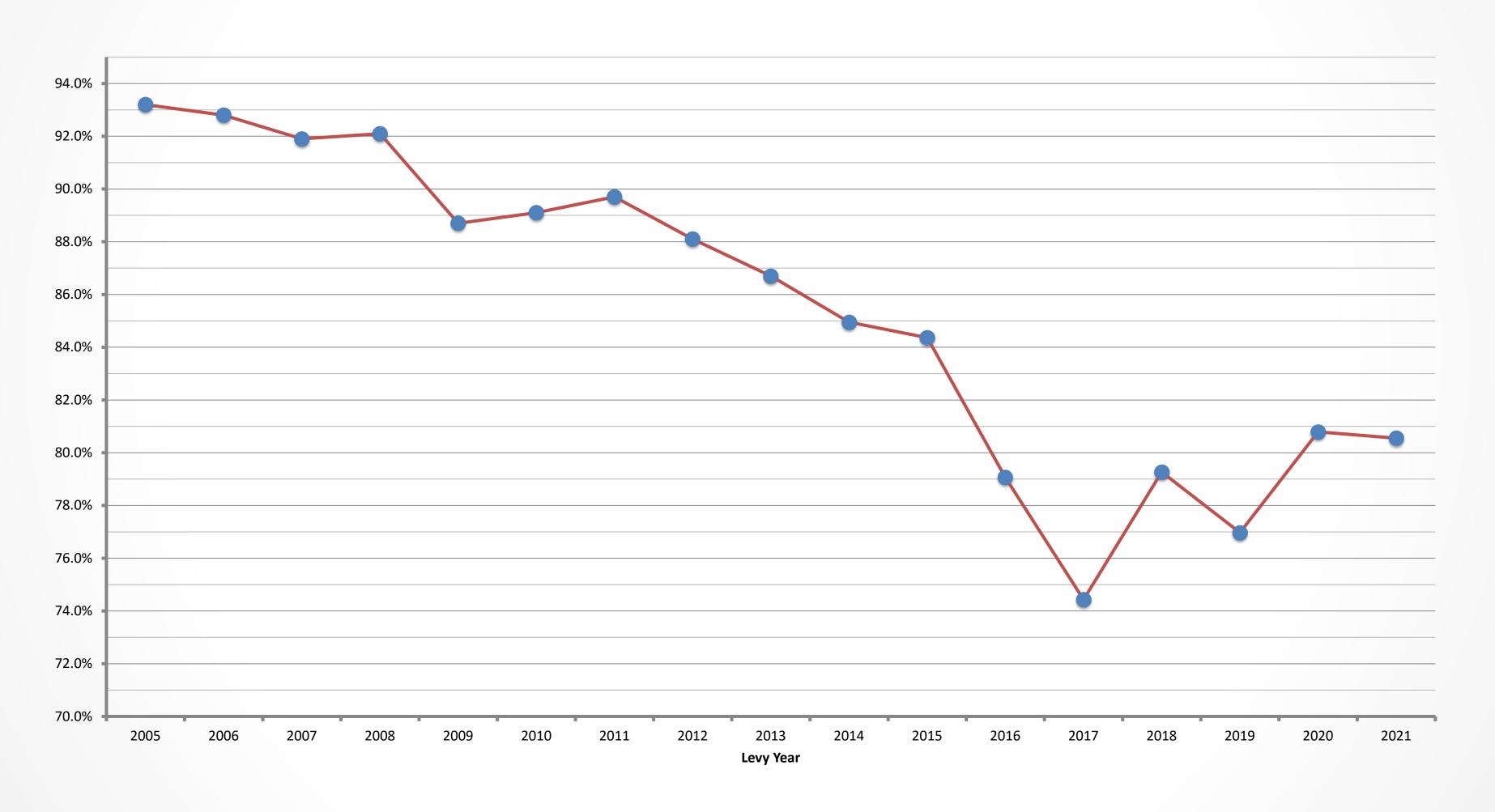


# Major Positive Factor Impacting Financial Condition Increasing Evidenced-Based Funding Revenues

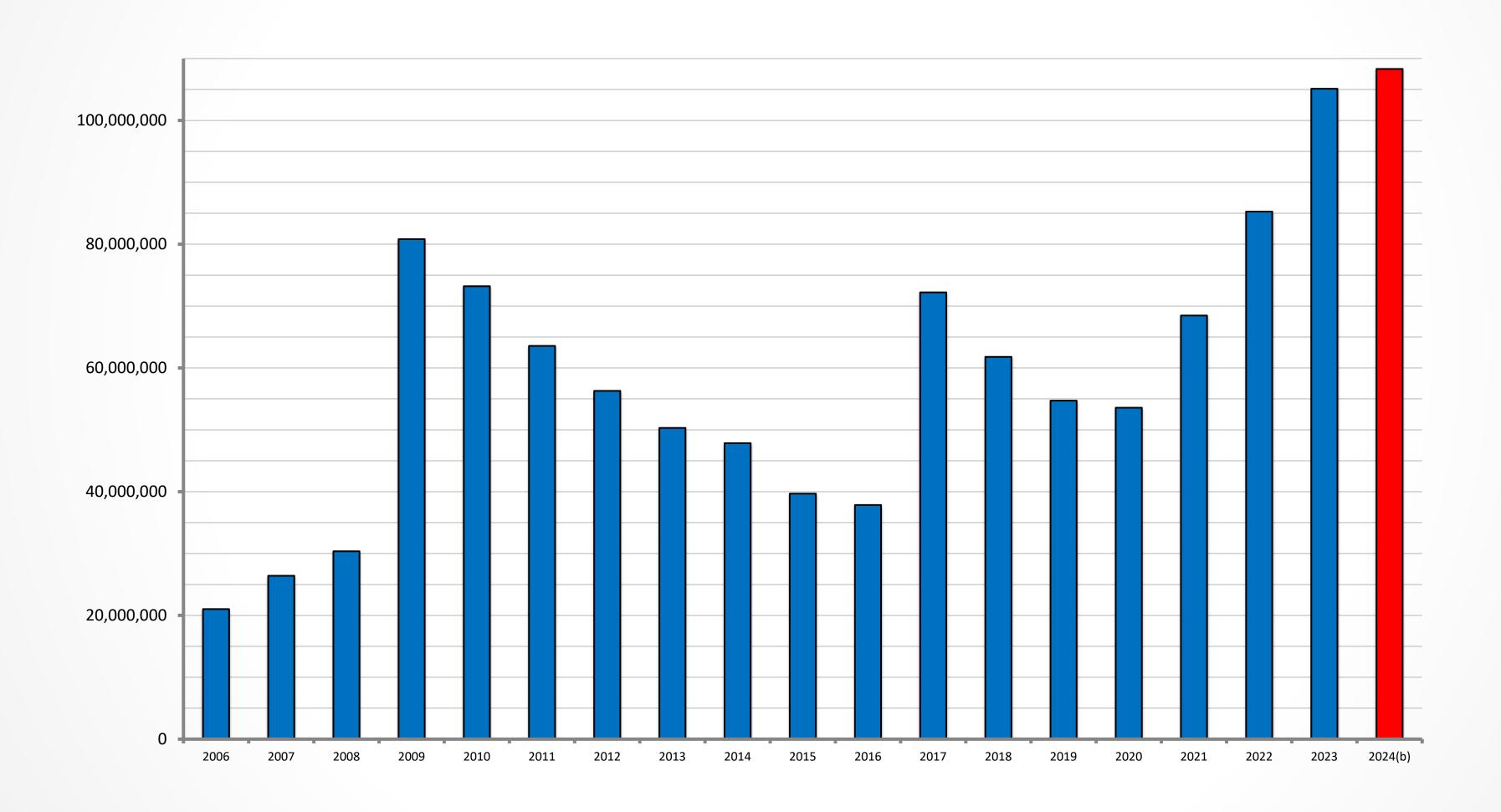


#### Major Negative Factor Impacting Financial Condition
